DETAILS:

About 1030, 05 Nov 03, [redacted] interviewed [redacted] Central Intelligence Agency (CIA), who stated he arrived with his team at the Abu Ghraib Prison around 0500, 04 Nov 03. At this time according to [redacted] Mr. Manadal AL-JAMAIDI was changed from his personal clothes (stripped pants and a white shirt) into an orange detainee jumpsuit. Additionally, the flex cuffs, which he had been wearing, were removed and he was bound with standard handcuffs. [redacted] further related that Mr. AL-JAMAIDI was brought to an interrogation cell at the prison around 0530 and at this point he left [redacted] and [redacted] to continue with their interrogation of Mr. AL-JAMAIDI. [redacted] stated that he was informed at approximately 0730 by [redacted] that Mr. AL-JAMAIDI had slumped over during the interrogation and was not responsive.

About 1505, 05 Nov 03, SA [redacted] [redacted] this office, interviewed [redacted] Interpreter/Translator, CIA, who stated he was in a vehicle behind U.S. Navy Sea Air Land (SEAL) Team 7. He was unable to see the face of Mr. AL-JAMAIDI when he was apprehended from his residence. [redacted] spoke with Mr. AL-JAMAIDI moments after his arrest but did not see his face due to it being covered by a hood. [redacted] also stated he arrived at the Abu Ghraib Prison about 0400 with the apprehension team. Mr. AL-JAMAIDI was taken to a separate room where he was changed into an orange prison uniform. Shortly after this, [redacted] and [redacted] CIA, began their interrogation of Mr. AL-JAMAIDI. [redacted] stated the interrogation lasted a couple of hours. During the interrogation, Mr. AL-JAMAIDI was on his knees with his hands cuffed behind his back and his ankles were secured. At some point during the questioning, Mr. AL-JAMAIDI's head slumped to one side while he was talking. At first [redacted] and [redacted] thought Mr. AL-JAMAIDI was faking an illness. [redacted] observed that Mr. AL-JAMAIDI had stopped breathing. They then summoned assistance from U.S. Military Personnel and then departed the room.

AGENT's COMMENT: [redacted] heard that Mr. AL-JAMAIDI strongly resisted arrest by the SEAL Team.

About 1510, 05 Nov 03, SA [redacted] interviewed [redacted] who stated that he, [redacted] and [redacted] were part of a team along with SEAL Team 7, on a mission to apprehend Mr. AL-JAMAIDI at his residence. Mr. [redacted] explained that Mr. AL-JAMAIDI was once a captain in the Iraqi Army, and is currently a suspected terrorist cell leader who has a cache of some two tons of explosives, to include chemical agents, which he purported was to use in attacks against coalition forces. Additionally, [redacted] confirmed that Mr. AL-JAMAIDI was strongly suspected of facilitating logically and materially, the recent attacks against the Al Rasheed Hotel and the International Red Cross in Baghdad. [redacted] related how SEAL Team 7 raided Mr. AL-JAMAIDI's residence at approximately 0200, 4 Nov 03, and brought him to the Special Forces compound adjacent to Baghdad International Airport (BIAP). [redacted] interrogated Mr.

DETAILS

AL-JAMAIDI for approximately one hour and garnered Mr. AL-JAMAIDI's name and that he claimed to know some of the suspected terrorist cell leaders in the Baghdad area. According to [redacted], Mr. AL-JAMAIDI was transported by the same apprehension team to the Abu Ghraib Prison at approximately 0500. At this point [redacted] stated Mr. AL-JAMAIDI was changed from his personal clothing into an orange detainee jumpsuit. At approximately 0530, [redacted] and [redacted] resumed the interrogation of Mr. AL-JAMAIDI. Some time around 0700, while answering a question, Mr. AL-JAMAIDI's head slumped over to the side. [redacted] stated Mr. AL-JAMAIDI's chest was not moving, so he removed his hood to further observe his condition. At this point [redacted] summoned the Military Police to seek medical assistance for Mr. AL-JAMAIDI. At this point, both men left the interrogation cell.

AGENT'S COMMENT: [redacted] claimed he at no time observed Mr. AL-JAMAIDI's face until the removal of the hood at the Abu Ghraib Prison. Additionally, [redacted] stated that Mr. AL-JAMAIDI's face had no medical bandage upon removal of the hood. He did claim to observe the swollen and bruised condition of Mr. AL-JAMAIDI's face. [redacted] related that Mr. AL-JAMAIDI was resisting arrest and would not cooperate with the commands of the SEAL Team on several occasions. He also stated that Mr. AL-JAMAIDI's hands were bound during the interview with handcuffs, which were joined behind his back. Further, [redacted] stated that at no time during either interrogation, did Mr. AL-JAMAIDI voice any medical concerns.

DETAILS

Basis for Investigation: About 2245, 4 Nov 03, SA [] was notified by CW5 [] Group Operations Officer, 3rd Military Police Group (CID), of the death of an Iraqi national at the Abu Ghraib prison.

Between 1000 and 1030, 5 Nov 03, SA [] conducted a death scene examination of the prison shower on the second floor of the prison.

CHARACTERISTICS OF THE SCENE: The shower room is located on the second floor of the Abu Ghraib prison in wing A-1, along the western wall or the northern wing. The room is constructed of concrete and cinder block material with a drain along the west wall, centered between north and south. The shower room is approximately 10-foot wide and 20 foot long. The shower room has a concrete floor and a concrete ceiling. The shower room has a window along the west wall near the north end of the room. The window has bars and a cage over it to prevent anyone from escaping. The shower room has a doorway along the east wall with a door made of bars. Also along the east wall are three other doorways with bars, which have been locked shut and do not open. The shower room is equipped with two fluorescent lights along the east wall. One of the fluorescent lights did not work.

CONDITION OF THE SCENE: The shower room was clean of debris. There was a meal ready to eat box in the center of the room near the north wall. There was a plastic bag with an orange jump suit and trash located next to the door along the east wall. There was a plastic bottle of chlorine located next to the plastic bag. There was a black in color body bag along the south wall, with the deceased individual inside. There were no stains on the floor or wall area at the time of the exam. There were sheets placed over the bar doors, to prevent people from seeing into the room. There were no unusual odors detected.

ENVIRONMENTAL CONDITIONS: The temperature outside was approximately 90 degrees Fahrenheit and the sun was shining. The temperature inside was approximately 80 degrees Fahrenheit. There was no precipitation in the past twenty-four hours.

FACTORS PERTINENT TO ENTRY/EXIT: Access to the scene could only be gained through the main doorway into the shower room.

SCENE DOCUMENTATION: A crime scene sketch was prepared by SA [] SA [] exposed photographs of the scene utilizing a Kodak EasyShare DX4900 digital camera built in flash.

SEARCH FOR LATENT IMPRESSIONS: A search for latent impressions was not conducted due to the personnel being present at the scene not being in question.

DETAILS

SEARCH BEYOND THE SCENE: A search beyond the scene was not conducted.

About 1210, 8 Nov 03, [redacted] interviewed SPC [redacted] 130-58-1797, Headquarter Service Company (HSC), 109th Medical Battalion (Iowa City, Iowa), Abu Ghraib Prison, Iraq, who stated he did not remember what time the incident occurred. SPC [redacted] stated himself and SGT [redacted] responded to the hard cells reference a man who stopped breathing. SPC [redacted] stated when they arrived on scene, an Iraqi doctor was already there and was checking the body for a heart beat. SPC [redacted] stated the Iraqi doctor stated the individual was dead and no lifesaving efforts were taken. SPC [redacted] stated he did not recall seeing a bandage on the individuals face when he assisted the doctor. SPC [redacted] stated the body was laying near the shower drain, face down when he entered the shower room.

About 1245, 8 Nov 03, SA [redacted] interviewed Dr. [redacted] Abu Ghraib Prison, Iraq, who stated he responded to the cell block reference one of the prisoners had stopped breathing. Dr. [redacted] stated when he arrived on scene, the man was laying on his stomach. Dr. [redacted] stated he checked the body for vital signs, which met with negative results. Dr. [redacted] stated he did not take any life saving measures once he determined the man was dead. Dr. [redacted] stated the man had not been dead long, when he arrived. Dr. [redacted] stated he did notice injuries to the mans face when he was checking him for vital signs.
