INVESTIGATIVE SUMMARY:

About 1011, 13 Jan 04, this office was notified by CPT [REDACTED], Battle Captain, 3rd Brigade, 4th Infantry Division (4ID), Samarra, Iraq, APO AE 09323, of an alleged drowning of a local national who was detained by 4ID soldiers.

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Investigation established probable cause to believe 1LT [REDACTED] the platoon leader, committed the offenses of Involuntary Manslaughter and Aggravated Assault when he gave an unlawful order to his subordinates to have Mr. FADHIL and Mr. [REDACTED] forced into a river, which resulted in the death of Mr. FADHIL. Further, 1LT [REDACTED] committed the offenses of False Official Statement, Conspiracy and Obstruction of Justice when he provided a statement he knew to be false and further conspired to hinder the investigation by manufacturing a cover up story.

Investigation established probable cause to believe SGT [REDACTED] and SPC [REDACTED] committed the offenses of Involuntary Manslaughter and Aggravated Assault when they forced Mr. [REDACTED] and Mr. FADHIL into the river, which resulted in the death of Mr. FADHIL.

Further, SGT [REDACTED] SPC [REDACTED] SPC [REDACTED] and SGT [REDACTED] committed the offenses of False Official Statement and Conspiracy when they provided a statement they knew to be false and conspired to hinder the investigation by going along with the cover up story.

Investigation established probable cause to believe CPT [REDACTED] committed the offenses of Conspiracy, Obstruction of Justice and Accessory after the Fact when he conspired to hinder the investigation by going along with the cover up story after having knowledge of the incident.

Investigation established probable cause to believe SFC [REDACTED] the platoon sergeant, committed the offenses of Involuntary Manslaughter and Conspiracy when he supported the unlawful order given to his subordinates by 1LT [REDACTED] to have Mr. FADHIL and Mr. [REDACTED] forced into a river, which resulted in the death of Mr. FADHIL. Further, SFC [REDACTED] committed the offense of Obstruction of Justice when he failed to report the incident after having knowledge of what occurred.

Investigation established probable cause to believe MA [REDACTED] and LTC [REDACTED] committed the offenses of Conspiracy, Obstruction of Justice and Accessory after the Fact when they had knowledge of the incident and failed to report the incident to law enforcement.

Investigation established probable cause to believe SGT [REDACTED] committed the offense of Aggravated Assault and Conspiracy when he conspired with SGT [REDACTED] and forced an unknown Iraqi male into a body of water in Balad, which was directed by SFC [REDACTED] during a previous incident. Further, SGT [REDACTED] committed the offense of False Official Statement when he denied having any knowledge of the incident in Balad, which he knew to be false.

Further investigation revealed from 3 Jan 04 – 15 Jan 04, several attempts were made by Mr. [REDACTED] Site Director, to retrieve the remains of Mr. FADHIL by closing the dam in the river. On 15 Jan 04, when the remains of Mr. FADHIL were found, he was positively identified by family members and by his identification card, which was found on Mr. FADHIL's remains.

I, Mr. [REDACTED], want to make the following statement under oath: On 3 January 2004, I woke up in Baghdad where me and my cousin were visiting a friend and going shopping to pick-up plumbing supplies. My cousin that was with me was Mr. Zaydun Ma'mun FADHIL, he was born in 1984. We woke up between 8-9 am and went shopping for the plumbing supplies we then went back to visit our friend for a while and then we left to go back home to Samarra about 5pm. It was me and my cousin and we were driving a 2001 white Kia Pick-up Truck. The vehicle began to act up and something was wrong. The engine seemed not be getting enough gas. I tried to fix it and it continued to run but only very slowly. It was only going about 20mph all the way until we got to Balad. We got to Balad around 2130-2145 and they thought about staying in Balad because the vehicle was driving so slowly but he was able to fix it to make the vehicle drive faster. They then left Balad around 2215 and they continued to Samarra. Between 2230-2245 we arrived at the ICDC (Iraqi Civil Defense Corp) check point where they searched our vehicle and the both of us. They did not find anything and they reminded us that it was getting close to curfew, which is at 2300 for Samarra. I knew I was close to home and that I would make it before curfew. There was two guys at the check point who searched us and the vehicle and I noticed a few other guys around the check point but I don't how many of them there were. We left the checkpoint and I don't remember how long I was at the checkpoint before I left but we left the checkpoint and I was speeding to make it home before curfew. We were about 2-3 miles away from the checkpoint and we could see a US Military Convoy coming down the road in the opposite direction. As soon as they noticed us the convoy surrounded us with three vehicles. The US Soldiers then got out and two soldiers got them out of the vehicle and others were in the area and the soldiers searched my vehicle and searched us. We were both put into a Bradley vehicle and we were both handcuffed with a soft type of handcuff that they tied up on our wrists behind our backs. I could hear the soldiers trying to talk Arabic and I asked them if they knew Arabic and one of the soldiers said he spoke a little bit in Arabic. The one that spoke Arabic a little was white and the other one who helped with the searches was a little darker skinned about my complexion. They then let us go and we got into our vehicle and we only drove about 20 meters down the road before the same US Soldiers stopped us again. We were told to get out of the vehicle and that's when we were handcuffed and put into the back of the vehicle. That happened about 2255 and we were not told why we were being arrested, if they told us, I did not understand what they said. We were both put into a Bradley vehicle and we were both handcuffed with a soft type of handcuff that they tied up on our wrists behind our backs. After we were put into the vehicle

the door was shut and we were in there with five other soldiers. The vehicle began to move and we did not know where we were going. My cousin and me could not see where we were going. We were moving in the vehicle about 10-15 minutes and then we stopped. I could see the lights from the ICDC check point people and I think the soldiers believed they were too close to the check point. We then keep on going farther away and then that's when they stopped again. They got us both out of the vehicle and we were on a bridge and we were facing the water and they un-handcuffed me and my cousin and were telling us to jump into the water. We refused to jump into the water and I knew my cousin could not swim and even I cannot swim very well. My cousin did not jump into the water and then one of the soldiers pushed him from behind. I did see the soldier who pushed my cousin, he looked skinny and not very tall and his skin was a little darker than white. I could see him in the water trying to swim and then one of the soldiers pushed me too. I did not see who pushed me because they were behind me. After we were pushed into the water, my cousin and me were screaming each other's name trying to find each other but then after a few minutes I did hear him anymore. I saw him in the water after I was pushed in too and I could only hear him but I never got close enough to help him. I then made it to the side on the water and I was very scared. I got out of the water and I was hiding until the American Soldiers were gone. They initially had stayed by the bridge for a few minutes and I could hear them laughing at us after we were pushed into the water and then they left. I walked back to the ICDC check point but it took me a while to walk there because I was making sure nobody saw me and I did not want the soldiers to get me again. I finally got to the same ICDC checkpoint that I was searched at earlier and I told them what happened. I told them that US Soldiers pushed my cousin and me into the water by the bridge. I was still soak and wet from the incident. The ICDC people and myself went back to the area where we were pushed and we began to search for my cousin. We searched for about 15 minutes and we did not find him.

A: It was found by about 1 kilometer from the bridge that takes you to Tikrit, family and locals have been searching for the body since 3 Jan 04.

Q: Does the water located where the body was found the same stream of water from the bridge you were pushed from?

A: Yes

A: No, I never said that. The soldiers were happy and laughing and I was even laughing with them even though I didn't really understand what they were saying. That must be an error in translation of that letter or something. I never said the soldiers appeared drunk or tired. They were ok.

Q: What was your cousin wearing on the night of the incident?

A: He was wearing blue jeans, a white short sleeve shirt, a short leather jacket, and shoes.

Q: I just showed you a picture of your cousin, Mr. FADHIL, is this the same man that was with you on the night this incident occurred?

A: Yes, that is him.

Q: Did you see your cousin's body after it was found?

A: Yes.

Q: What injuries did the body have?

A: His face appeared to be hit, his nose and upper lip were cut and there was bruising on his head. His head was intact but it looked like it was hit or like it banged on something while in the water.

Q: Where was the body buried?

A: The new cemetery "Aldoleyah Road" on the south end of Samarra.

Q: When was the body buried?

A: Yesterday, we found the body at 1130-1200 and we buried him by 1500.

Q: Did you photograph the body before it was buried?

A: Yes we took photos which are being developed and we also took video on a CD which I can get a copy for you by tomorrow.

Q: Why do you think soldiers would push you into the water?

A: I would like to know why. I have no idea.

Q: Do you believe the soldiers were trying to kill you and your cousin?

A: I don't know, maybe they were trying to teach us a lesson about being out after curfew but the lesson is very painful and my cousin is now dead.

Q: Did the soldiers make any attempts to get you and your cousin out of the water after you were in the water?

A: No. They stayed looking at us for a few minutes and then they left.

Q: Did you see the soldiers again after they left you and your cousin in the water?

A: No.

Since it was after 2300 we stopped the vehicle because it was in violation of the curfew set at 2300. We stopped the vehicle at approx. 2330. When the vehicle was stopped we set up security and conducted a search of the individuals and the vehicle. Since I am the driver I stayed in my vehicle. I was the lead vehicle so I could see the search being conducted. I observed someone looking at the identification cards of the two Iraqis. I also overheard on the radio someone asking for the black list to check the names of these two Iraqis on it. I don't know the names of the Iraqis. The Iraqis were in front of my vehicle for about 5 minutes then they were escorted to the side of my vehicle. I did not see any type of hard cuffs on these Iraqis while they were in front of my vehicle. A few minutes later LT [REDACTED] radioed me to drop the ramp on my vehicle. I also heard on the radio that these Iraqis were going to be detained for curfew violation. The Iraqis were placed in the back of my vehicle and once they were in I closed the ramp and we headed for the detainment facility. About half-way towards the detainment facility we stopped the vehicles, and I was told to lower the ramp. About two minutes later I was told to raise the ramp and we drove off. I, SGT [REDACTED] want to make the following statement under oath: I don't remember the date exactly but it was sometime in the beginning of Jan 04, my platoon, which is 1st Platoon, began patrolling the city of Samarra. Our shift started, I believe, at 1800 and it ended at 2400 that night. I'm not sure how many vehicles were in the convoy. But I know it was at least four vehicles and they were all Bradleys. I don't remember who was all in each Bradley and I don't remember where my vehicle was in the convoy because I was in the back of the Bradley and I really wasn't looking. I know SGT [REDACTED]

SPC [REDACTED] and SPC [REDACTED] were in the back of my Bradley, which is A11. The platoon leader, LT [REDACTED] his driver, I'm not sure what his name was and the gunner, SPC [REDACTED] were also on the Bradley. About 2300 that night, after we had been doing walking patrol in Samarra, we were picked up by our vehicle again and we were enroute back to FOB Brassfield/Mora. On the way back, we stopped, we all got out of the vehicle and I saw a white truck on the road. There were two guys in the truck. The truck was already stopped when I saw it. I walked up to the truck and I don't remember who walked to the truck with me, but we searched the two guys and asked them for Identification and we searched their vehicle. They both had identification but one guys ID did not match him. I can't remember which guys didn't match. Myself and SPC [REDACTED]

went up to the LT and I told him that one of the guys ID didn't match and he told me to detain them and put them in the back of the Bradley. And that's what we did. We put the flexy cuffs on them and placed them into the Bradley, A11. They did not return to their truck and drive for 20 meters like they are reporting. Once we removed them from the truck they did not get back into the truck. After we got them in the Bradley I was assuming we were going to take them to the EPW camp or the CMOC but we didn't. We had them for about 10-15 minutes and the convoy was still moving. But we stopped and the LT, LT [REDACTED]

yelled out to let the detainees go. He didn't say why he wanted to let them go. The ramp opened to the Bradley, I got our first, then SPC [REDACTED] got out, and I looked up at the LT to see what was going on. He told me we were going to let them go. That's when I told SPC [REDACTED] and SPC [REDACTED] to let's get them out of the Bradley. We got them out and they were still handcuffed. We never covered their faces. I asked if anyone had a knife to cut the Flexy Cuffs and SPC [REDACTED] said he had one or something and I told him to cut the cuffs. I think SPC [REDACTED] cut the cuffs on both the guys.

SPC [REDACTED] was pulling security. We were on a road and it was dark and I never saw the stream of water or anything. I don't know what these guys are talking about. WE cut the cuffs off and left them there on the side of the road.

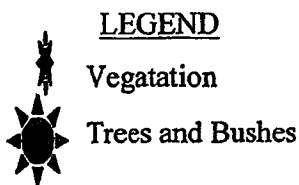
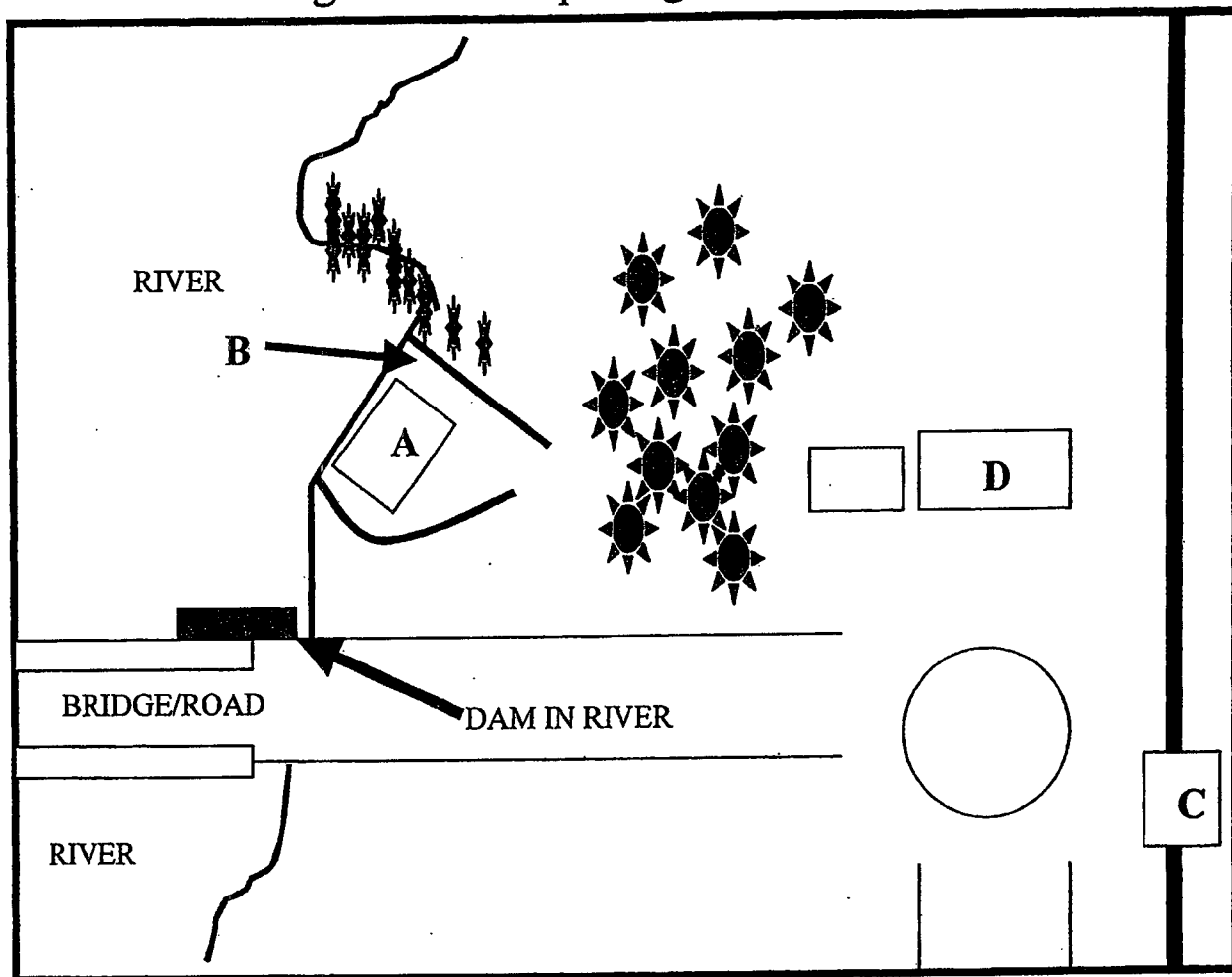

I would like to correct some of the fallacies in my statement.

1) When we stopped [REDACTED] & SGT [REDACTED] & myself got out of the Bradley. [REDACTED] and I watched the EPW'S while SGT [REDACTED] went to see what was going on. He came back and told us to bring the EPW'S to the edge of the water. I refused to be apart of it, so I stayed by the Brads. See at the beginning of the patrol SFC [REDACTED] had said over the radio that any curfew breakers we get would be put in the river. SGT [REDACTED] went behind some concrete dividers. I heard a splash. They came back a few seconds later. As we were mounting the Brads, I thought I saw 2 people on the peninsula.

Q: When you say EPW'S, what are you referring to?

A: Enemy Prisoner of War.

Q: What do you mean by curfew beakers?

A: Iraqi's out after curfew.

Q: What time is curfew?

A: I am not sure.

Q: Can you further identify SFC [REDACTED]

A: He is my Platoon Sergeant. I believe his first name is [REDACTED]

Q: Can you tell me who was on patrol that night from your platoon?

A: My entire platoon.

Q: How many soldiers are in your platoon?

A: About 32.

Q: How many Bradley's were in the convoy?

A: At least four.

Q: What time did your patrol detain the EPW 'S?

A: I do not know, I was just told they violated the curfew.

Q: Why were they detained?

A: I was told because of the curfew.

Q: What happened when they were detained?

A: Initially they were searched and their vehicle was searched. They were initially detained because one of them showed us what we believed was a fake ID card. 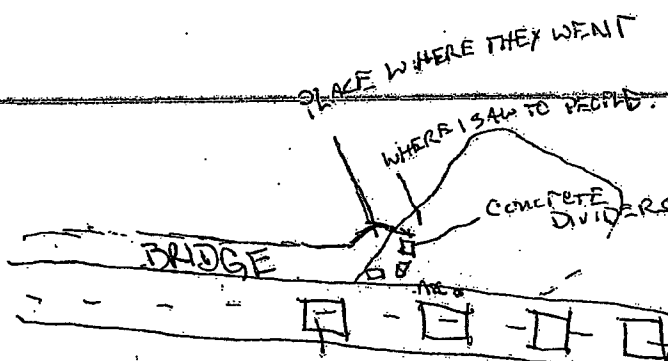

Preliminary investigation revealed Mr. [REDACTED] Samarra, Iraq (NFI), reported to the Iraqi Civil Defense Corp (ICDC) on 3 Jan 04, that he and his cousin, Mr. Zaydun Ma'mun FADHIL, Samarra, Iraq (NFI) were detained by the American forces which resulted in the death of Mr. FADHIL.

Further investigation revealed that Mr. [REDACTED] approached the ICDC security check point in Samarra, late in the evening of 3 Jan 04 or early in the morning of 4 Jan 04, and reported he and Mr. FADHIL were stopped, searched and later detained by the American Forces. He reported that after they were detained they were both pushed off of a bridge into a river and Mr. FADHIL apparently drowned.

On 16 Jan 04, Mr. [REDACTED] was interviewed by USACIDC and stated he and Mr. FADHIL were returning from Baghdad, where they had purchased some plumbing supplies. He stated that about 2230, 3 Jan 04, while traveling to their home in Samarra, they arrived at the ICDC check point. Mr. [REDACTED] stated at the check point their vehicle was searched, their identifications cards were checked, and they were allowed to proceed. However, they were instructed to immediately go to their residences as the curfew was nearing (2300). Mr. [REDACTED] said they departed the checkpoint and about 2 or 3 kilometers away they approached an oncoming American convoy. He said the Americans stopped their vehicle and instructed them to exit the vehicle. According to Mr. [REDACTED] their vehicle was searched, they were personally searched and then they were handcuffed and placed in the rear of a military vehicle, later identified as a Bradley Fighting Vehicle (BFV). Mr. [REDACTED] stated they were never informed why they were being detained but were released before the vehicle drove away. He said they got back into their vehicle and drove about 20 meters, when the same soldiers once again stopped them, handcuffed them again and placed them in the back of the BFV. Mr. [REDACTED] indicated the BFV drove away and about 15 minutes later it stopped and they were ordered to exit the vehicle, and once he got out of the vehicle he could see the lights from the ICDC check point and they were un-cuffed and instructed to stand near the bridge. Mr. [REDACTED] stated once they stood near the bridge, the soldiers instructed them to jump off of it and when they did not a soldier approached MR. FADHIL and pushed him off into the water and soon after he also was pushed into the water. Mr. [REDACTED] said when he went into the water he could hear Mr. FADHIL screaming because he did not know how to swim, but he was unable to get to him due to the strong currents in the water. Mr. [REDACTED] stated he swam to the shore and hid because he could hear the soldiers laughing about the incident. Mr. [REDACTED] described the soldier that pushed Mr. FADHIL as skinny, not very tall and his skin was a little darker than white. He was unable to describe the soldier that pushed him into the water and was not sure if was the same person or another soldier standing near by. Mr. [REDACTED] stated once the soldiers departed he made his way back to the ICDC check point and reported the incident to the Iraqi guards, who went back to the river with him to assist in the search of Mr. FADHIL. He stated they could not find him and he spent the remainder of the night at the ICDC area. The next morning when he returned to his vehicle he discovered it had been destroyed by unknown means. Photographs were exposed of the vehicle by a friend and the local community continued to search for the body of Mr. FADHIL. The photographs of the vehicle were obtained by USACIDC, and a review of the prints depicts enormous damage to the vehicle and a trailer, apparently caused by a BFV running completely over it.

On 15 Jan 04, the remains of Mr. FADHIL were apparently discovered by the local nationals and he was soon thereafter buried in a local cemetery. Photographs were also exposed of the human remains. According to Mr. [REDACTED] Mr. FADHIL had injuries to his head and facial area caused by unknown means. Photographs of the human remains have not yet been collected by USACIDC to confirm the identity of the human remains in relation to Mr. FADHIL.

On 16 Jan 04, three members of the ICDC on duty the night of the incident were interviewed.

b7C-4 They were, PFC [REDACTED] (NFI); PFC [REDACTED] (NFI); and CPL [REDACTED] (NFI). Each of them stated they recalled the two Iraqi's coming through their check point and being cleared by themselves. They stated that about 15 minutes after releasing the vehicle they observed an American convoy stop near the bridge and remain there for about 5 minutes. They were unable to see any specific acts or movements and were unable to hear what was being said, although they said they could hear some talking. They stated that about 5 minutes after the convoy departed they observed an individual approaching their check point, later identified as Mr. [REDACTED]. They said he was soaking wet and informed them that the Americans had thrown he and Mr. FADHIL from the bridge into the water. Members of the ICDC assisted in a search for Mr. FADHIL, but were unable to locate the body. b6-5

Additional investigative activities resulted in the identification of the soldiers involved in this incident. This was accomplished by obtaining historical data of particular units and their mission for that particular date and location. As a result of this investigative activity, the particular soldiers involved were interviewed and all denied any wrongdoing pertaining to this investigation.

Eight soldiers were identified as being at the scene and interviewed, three under rights advisement. One of the soldiers interviewed, SSG [REDACTED] A Company, 1/8th Infantry, stated they stopped the vehicle because of a curfew violation and the Iraqi's were detained. He stated he did not exit his vehicle but heard what was transpiring over the radio and that he called the 1LT to request permission to run over the detainee's vehicle with his BFV. According to SSG [REDACTED], he was denied permission and the convoy proceeded with the detainees in the front BFV, and their vehicle left behind undamaged. SSG [REDACTED] related that a few minutes later the convoy stopped and he heard the detainees were being released because of a shortage at the detention facility. SSG [REDACTED] said as the convoy drove away he observed the two detainees standing near the bridge. SSG [REDACTED] denied he witnessed, assisted, or conspired with anyone to throw the two detainees into the river. side of the road as the convoy drove away. 1LT [REDACTED] denied he ordered, witnessed, or had any knowledge of the two detainees being thrown into the river.

On 16 Jan 04, SPC [REDACTED], A Company, 1/8th Infantry ([REDACTED]), was interviewed under rights advisement and denied any wrongdoing pertaining to this investigation. SPC [REDACTED] stated after the two Iraqi's were detained they drove a while and then the convoy stopped. SPC [REDACTED] stated they were directed to release the two detainees, so he, SGT [REDACTED] and SPC [REDACTED] exited the BFV with the two detainees. He stated SGT [REDACTED] supervised, SPC [REDACTED] provided him with the knife and then pulled security, while he [REDACTED] removed the cuffs from the two detainees. SPC [REDACTED] stated that after the cuffs were removed, SGT [REDACTED] told the two detainees to leave, and the three of them got back inside the BFV and departed. He said the last time he saw the two detainees, they were walking along the side of the road.

On 16 Jan 04, SGT [REDACTED], A Company, 1/8th Infantry, was interviewed under rights advisement and denied any wrongdoing pertaining to this investigation. SGT [REDACTED] stated they stopped the vehicle for a curfew violation and during a search they discovered one of them had a false identification card. It was then decided to detain the two Iraqi's. SGT [REDACTED] stated they loaded the two Iraqi's into the BFV and departed. He said about 15 minutes after leaving they stopped the vehicles and 1LT [REDACTED] told him to release the detainees; so he, SPC [REDACTED] and SPC [REDACTED] exited the vehicle, removed the cuffs, and left the two Iraqi's standing on the side of the road. SGT [REDACTED] stated that when he got back into the BFV, the two Iraqi's were still standing on the side of the road. He also stated he did not know they were located near a river or bridge, because it was dark and he couldn't see. It should be noted that there was a light near the bridge and the ICDC checkpoint had numerous lights illuminating the immediate area, and others interviewed were aware of the bridge being there. SGT [REDACTED] matches the description provided by the surviving victim of the individual that pushed Mr. FADHIL from the bridge. SGT [REDACTED] continued to deny he pushed either of the two Iraqi's into the river, denied he observed either of the two Iraqi's being pushed into the river, and denied he planned with any members of his unit to conceal the act of pushing the two Iraqi's into the river.

The other three soldiers (SGT [REDACTED], SGT [REDACTED], and SPC [REDACTED]) all of A company, 1/8th Infantry, were interviewed and denied having any knowledge of wrongdoing pertaining to this investigation. Each of them were in the back of another BFV and apparently never dismounted their vehicle.

On 16 Jan 04, SPC [REDACTED] was interviewed under rights advisement and denied any wrongdoing pertaining to this investigation. SPC [REDACTED] stated after they had detained the two Iraqi's, the convoy stopped and they were instructed to release the two detainees. He said himself, SPC [REDACTED] and SGT [REDACTED] exited the BFV and he pulled security, SPC [REDACTED] removed the cuffs, and SGT [REDACTED] supervised. He stated they escorted the

two detainees near the bridge on the right side of the road, removed the cuffs, and SGT [REDACTED] told them (the detainees) to leave. A: Yes. As I pulled away from the site of detaining the individuals, the vehicle was not in the condition or location that I have seen on the video. After talking to my platoon sergeant that night, the vehicle was pushed to the south side of Albino St. I was not aware of any significant damage that could be caused by pushing the vehicle with a BFV.

Q: Was there any other units patrolling the area that night?

A: Not that I know of.

Q: Did any member of your platoon destroy the detainees vehicle the night they were detained?

A: I know it was pushed but I don't know the extent of damage the vehicle sustained.

Q: Do you know which soldier pushed the vehicle out of the road with a BFV?

A: SFC [REDACTED] BFV. The driver was I believe PFC [REDACTED] b6-3, b7c-3

Q: Prior to this alleged incident, do you have any knowledge of members of your platoon throwing or forcing a detainee to jump or get into a river after being released in the past?

A: Yes, I have seen at least one detainee in a body of water in Balad somewhere. My platoon was conducting a mission with Special Forces and the detainee was an informant and I didn't see him being pushed or forced in the water, but I know he wasn't providing the information SF needed and he was put into the water. I don't know if members of my unit got him in the water or if it was SF. He then provided the information and he took us to where we needed to go for a raid. That happened months ago.

Q: Was there a bridge or floating bridge in that area where this occurred?

A: No.

Q: Is that the only knowledge you have about members of your unit placing anyone into a body of water?

A: No, there was another time where we had taken a detainee and then we released him on a floating bridge in BALAD, IRAQ. This detainee was detained because a kid he was with was flicking us off or had a toy gun or something and we took the guy just to teach them a lesson and he was released.

Q: When did this occur?

A: Probably Sep or Oct 03.

Q: Was that detainee in BALAD pushed or forced to get into a body of water by members of your unit?

A: I didn't see anyone pushing him into the water. I don't know.

Q: Do you have any knowledge that the detainee in BALAD was in fact either pushed or forced into the water by members of your unit?

A: No.

Q: Did you know that these two detainees were in the river that night in Samarra?

A: I'm not going to answer that question.

Q: Do you know for sure if your soldiers did anything to those two detainees other than release them on the road?

A: He was with us one of times we went back there.

I would like to correct my initial sworn statement to clarify what happened that night. We dismounted out of the Bradley's to detain 2 individuals that were out after curfew. I was pulling security while SPC [REDACTED] and SGT [REDACTED] searched the vehicle and detained the 2 individuals. We loaded up in the Bradley drove a ways, dropped ramp, got out and loaded back up. Drove a little bit farther, got out, the LT told us to throw them into the river. SGT [REDACTED] told the 1st guy to jump he said "No mister" in English. I'm not sure if he got pushed or jumped into the river. I told my guy to jump and he jumped, after that we loaded back up and left. Before this investigation started we went back out to the site and our LT jumped into the water to see how deep it was. He could stand up in the water. Our LT sat down with us and told us what to say in the investigation. Our CO also helped coached us along.

Q: What time did you detain the two Iraqi's?

A: My best guess would be about 2320.

Q: Can you provide me with a location or grid coordinate where you detained the two Iraqi's?

A: I don't know for sure where we were when we stopped them, I was in the back of a Bradley.

Q: Once they were detained, how long did you drive before the convoy stopped and they were forced into water?

A: About 10 minutes.

Q: Did you hear anyone say anything about throwing any curfew violators into the water earlier in the night?

A: Yes.

Q: Who?

A: SFC [REDACTED] b6-5, b7C-5

Q: Who is he?

A: My Platoon Sergeant.

Q: What did he say?

A: Somebody is getting wet tonight.

Q: What did he mean by that?

A: If anybody violated curfew tonight we would throw them into the water.

A: When we stopped, the ramp went down and everyone in my vehicle off-loaded to include the detainees, except for our doctor (SGT [REDACTED]). Then the LT said to take them over and throw them off by the pump house. We then walked them over and that is when they went into river.

Q: Who heard the LT order you guys to throw them into the water?

A: Just the three of us; Myself, SGT [REDACTED] and SPC [REDACTED]. He did not say it over the radio.

Q: Explain to me how many people were in your vehicle and who got out?

A: There were a total of nine people in our Bradley. Myself, SGT [REDACTED], SPC [REDACTED], the LT, the doctor, the gunner, the driver and the two detainees. Five of us exited the vehicle,

my self, SGT [REDACTED], SPC [REDACTED] and the two detainees. The remainder stayed in.

Q: When you walked to the river where was SPC [REDACTED]?

A: He stayed by the Bradley.

Q: Do you know why he stayed there instead of going to the river with you?

A: To pull security and he did not want anything to do with it.

when he said "No mister." He does not jump. Then SGT [REDACTED] says "You better fucking jump". I could not tell for sure if he

was pushed or if he jumped into the water, because of my guy standing in front of me. At this time I said "jump" and my guy jumped into the water. SGT [REDACTED] and I were then standing there by the pump house by ourselves. We then turned around and walked back to the Bradley. When we returned to the Bradley, I could see the LT smiling and saying something over the radio but I was unable to hear what he was saying. SGT [REDACTED] just told me to load up and we departed.

Q: How far was the drop from the edge to the top of the water?

A: About 10 feet.

Q: When they fell into the water did you hear anything else from either of the two detainees?

A: No.

Q: Did you ever see them again?

A: No.

Q: Who had the knife?

A: SPC [REDACTED] gave it to me before we started to walk. When we cut the cuffs we just left them laying on the ground.

Q: Did your platoon return to the scene of the incident a few days later, and why?

A: Not the entire platoon it was just our team and (myself [REDACTED] and [REDACTED], the LT, SFC [REDACTED] the Commanding Officer (CPT [REDACTED] and Major [REDACTED] (BN XO). I am not sure what the officers discussed before we went there. The LT had another change of clothes in the Bradley and went to change. INVESTIGATIVE/OPERATIONAL SUMMARY: Investigation was initiated on 13 Jan 04, when it was reported from Forward Operating Base (FOB) Brassfield, Samarra, Iraq, of an alleged murder of an Iraqi national by American forces. Preliminary investigation revealed Mr. [REDACTED] Samarra, Iraq (NFI), reported to the Iraqi Civil Defense Corp (ICDC) on 3 Jan 04, that he and his cousin, Mr. Zaydun Ma'mun FADHIL, Samarra, Iraq (NFI) were detained by the American forces which resulted in the death of Mr. FADHIL.

Further investigation revealed that Mr. [REDACTED] approached the ICDC security check point in Samarra, late in the evening of 3 Jan 04 or early in the morning of 4 Jan 04, and reported he and Mr. FADHIL were stopped, searched and later detained by the American Forces. He reported that after they were detained they were both pushed off of a bridge into a river and Mr. FADHIL apparently drowned.

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On 16 Jan 04, Mr. [REDACTED] was interviewed by USACIDC and stated he and Mr. FADHIL were returning from Baghdad, where they had purchased some plumbing supplies. He stated that about 2230, 3 Jan 04, while traveling to their home in Samarra, they arrived at the ICDC check point. Mr. [REDACTED] stated at the check point their vehicle was searched, their identifications cards were checked, and they were allowed to proceed. However, they were instructed to immediately go to their residences as the curfew was nearing (2300). Mr. [REDACTED] said they departed the checkpoint and about 2 or 3 kilometers away they approached an oncoming American convoy. He said the Americans stopped their vehicle and instructed them to exit the vehicle. According to Mr. [REDACTED] their vehicle was searched, they were personally searched and then they were handcuffed and placed in the rear of a military vehicle, later identified as a Bradley Fighting Vehicle (BFV). Mr. [REDACTED] stated they were never informed why they were being detained but were released before the vehicle drove away. He said they got back into their vehicle and drove about 20 meters, when the same soldiers once again stopped them, handcuffed them again and placed them in the back of the BFV. Mr. [REDACTED] indicated the BFV drove away and about 15 minutes later it stopped and they were ordered to exit the vehicle, and once he got out of the vehicle he could see the lights from the ICDC check point and they were un-cuffed and instructed to stand near the bridge. Mr. [REDACTED] stated once they stood near the bridge, the soldiers instructed them to jump off of it and when they did not a soldier approached MR. FADHIL and pushed him off into the water and soon after he also was pushed into the water. Mr. [REDACTED] said when he went into the water he could hear Mr. FADHIL screaming because he did not know how to swim, but he was unable to get to him due to the strong currents in the water. Mr. [REDACTED] stated he swam to the shore and hid because he could hear the soldiers laughing about the incident. Mr. [REDACTED] described the soldier that pushed Mr. FADHIL as skinny, not very tall and his skin was a little darker than white. He was unable to describe the soldier that pushed him into the water and was not sure if it was the same person or another soldier standing near by. Mr. [REDACTED] stated once the soldiers departed he made his way back to the ICDC check point and reported the incident to the Iraqi guards, who went back to the river with him to assist in the search of Mr. FADHIL. He stated they could not find him and he spent the remainder of the night at the ICDC area. The next morning when he returned to his vehicle he discovered it had been destroyed by unknown means. Photographs were exposed of the vehicle by a friend and the local community continued to search for the body of Mr. FADHIL. The photographs of the vehicle were obtained by USACIDC, and a review of the prints depicts enormous damage to the vehicle and a trailer, apparently caused by a BFV running completely over it.

On 15 Jan 04, the remains of Mr. FADHIL were apparently discovered by the local nationals and he was soon thereafter buried in a local cemetery. Photographs were also exposed of the human remains. According to Mr. [REDACTED], Mr. FADHIL had injuries to his head and facial area caused by unknown means. Photographs of the human remains have not yet been collected by USACIDC to confirm the identity of the human remains in relation to Mr. FADHIL.

On 16 Jan 04, three members of the ICDC on duty the night of the incident were interviewed. They were PFC [REDACTED] (NEI), PFC [REDACTED]

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(NFI); and CPL [REDACTED] Each of them stated they recalled the two Iraqi's coming through their check point and being cleared by themselves. They stated that about 15 minutes after releasing the vehicle they observed an American convoy stop near the bridge and remain there for about 5 minutes. They were unable to see any specific acts or movements and were unable to hear what was being said, although they said they could hear some talking. They stated that about 5 minutes after the convoy departed they observed an individual approaching their check point, later identified as Mr. [REDACTED]. They said he was soaking wet and informed them that the Americans had thrown Mr. FADHIL from the bridge into the water. Members of the ICDC assisted in a search for Mr. FADHIL, but were unable to locate the body.

Additional investigative activities resulted in the identification of the soldiers involved in this incident. This was accomplished by obtaining historical data of particular units and their mission for that particular date and location. As a result of this investigative activity, the particular soldiers involved were interviewed and all denied any wrongdoing pertaining to this investigation.

Eight soldiers were identified as being at the scene and interviewed, three under rights advisement. One of the soldiers interviewed, SSG [REDACTED] A Company, 1/8th Infantry, stated they stopped the vehicle because of a curfew violation and the Iraqi's were detained. He stated he did not exit his vehicle but heard what was transpiring over the radio and that he called the 1LT to request permission to run over the detainee's vehicle with his BFV. According to SSG [REDACTED] he was denied permission and the convoy proceeded with the detainees in the front BFV, and their vehicle left behind undamaged. SSG [REDACTED] related that a few minutes later the convoy stopped and he heard the detainees were being released because of a shortage at the detention facility. SSG [REDACTED] said as the convoy drove away he observed the two detainees standing near the bridge. SSG [REDACTED] denied he witnessed, assisted, or conspired with anyone to throw the two detainees into the river. He also denied he or anyone else in the convoy drove over the detainee's vehicle with their BFV.

On 16 Jan 04, 1LT [REDACTED] A Company, 1/8th Infantry, was interviewed and denied any wrongdoing pertaining to this investigation. 1LT [REDACTED] stated his unit was returning from their nightly patrols and stopped a vehicle that contained two Iraqi's for a curfew violation. He stated SGT [REDACTED] reported to him that one of the individuals had a false identification card as the photograph appeared to be that of a younger individual. 1LT [REDACTED] ordered that the two Iraqi's be detained and placed in the rear of their BFV. He said that once they were moving again, with the two detainees, he realized the detention facility was closed so he stopped and ordered SGT [REDACTED] to remove the flexi-cuffs and release the detainees. 1LT [REDACTED] said once that was accomplished they began rolling out and he looked in the mirror and observed the two detainees standing on the north side of the road as the convoy drove away. 1LT [REDACTED] denied he ordered, witnessed, or had any knowledge of the two detainees being thrown into the river.

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The other three soldiers (SGT [REDACTED], SGT [REDACTED], and SPC [REDACTED]) all of A company, 1/8th Infantry, were interviewed and denied having any knowledge of wrongdoing pertaining to this investigation. Each of them were in the back of another BFV and apparently never dismounted their vehicle. On 16 Jan 04, SGT [REDACTED] A Company, 1/8th Infantry, Ft. Carson, CO, was interviewed under rights advisement and denied any wrongdoing pertaining to this investigation. SGT [REDACTED] stated they stopped the vehicle for a curfew violation and during a search they discovered one of them had a false identification card. It was then decided to detain the two Iraqi's. SGT [REDACTED] stated they loaded the two Iraqi's into the BFV and departed. He said about 15 minutes after leaving they stopped the vehicles and 1LT [REDACTED] told him to release the detainees; so he, SPC [REDACTED] and SPC [REDACTED] exited the vehicle, removed the cuffs, and left the two Iraqi's standing on the side of the road. SGT [REDACTED] stated that when he got back into the BFV, the two Iraqi's were still standing on the side of the road. He also stated he did not know they were located near a river or bridge, because it was dark and he couldn't see. It should be noted that there was a light near the bridge and the ICDC checkpoint had numerous lights illuminating the immediate area, and others interviewed were aware of the bridge being there. SGT [REDACTED] matches the description provided by the surviving victim of the individual that pushed Mr. FADHIL from the bridge. SGT [REDACTED] continued to deny he pushed either of the two Iraqi's into the river, denied he observed either of the two Iraqi's being pushed into the river, and denied he planned with any members of his unit to conceal the act of pushing the two Iraqi's into the river.

On 16 Jan 04, SPC [REDACTED] A Company, 1/8th Infantry, was interviewed under rights advisement and denied any wrongdoing pertaining to this investigation. SPC [REDACTED] stated after they had detained the two Iraqi's, the convoy stopped and they were instructed to release the two detainees. He said himself, SPC [REDACTED] and SGT [REDACTED] exited the BFV and he pulled security, SPC [REDACTED] removed the cuffs, and SGT [REDACTED] supervised. He stated they escorted the two detainees near the bridge on the right side of the road, removed the cuffs, and SGT [REDACTED] told them (the detainees) to leave. SPC [REDACTED] stated the last time he saw the two detainees they were standing on the side of the road as the convoy departed.

On 16 Jan 04, SPC [REDACTED] was interviewed under rights advisement and denied any wrongdoing pertaining to this investigation. SPC [REDACTED] stated after the two Iraqi's were detained they drove a while and then the convoy stopped. SPC [REDACTED] stated they were directed to release the two detainees, so he, SGT [REDACTED] and SPC [REDACTED] exited the BFV with the two detainees. He stated SGT [REDACTED] supervised, SPC [REDACTED] provided him with the knife and then pulled security, while he [REDACTED] removed the cuffs from the two detainees. SPC [REDACTED] stated that after the cuffs were removed, SGT [REDACTED] told the two detainees to leave, and the three of them got back inside the BFV and departed. He said the last time he saw the two detainees, they were walking along the side of the road. SPC [REDACTED] was offered the opportunity to undergo a polygraph examination to verify the truthfulness of his statement, to which he agreed.

I, [REDACTED] want to make the following statement under oath:

I [REDACTED] is about to tell you everything that I know about the two Iraqi's going in the river. It was on 3 Jan and that night we were going to do a patrol in Sammara which we did, we walked around the streets for about 1 hour-1 1/2 hour, but before we did the patrol I overheard somebody say "Yeah we are going to do a patrol and then pick somebody up for a swim". So we did the patrol and I assumed that we were going back to Brassfield so we get back in the Bradley's and took off when the Bradley's stopped. My team and myself get out of the Bradley and there was a car right in front of it, so we told the guys in the car to get out. We searched them and the car. I thought that we stopped them for curfew violations at first, so we ask them for ID's. The skinny guy was legit and the chunky guy gave us a fake ID. We called it up to the LT and he said to detain him and place them in the back of the Bradley, so we did. So the Bradley starts moving and when it stopped we were by a ICDC checkpoint I believe. So the LT told us to get back in the Bradley's, so we did and when it stopped we were by the bridge and I believe the LT said if you don't feel good throwing them off of the bridge just throw him by the shore. So I walked by the shore and called the guys over. [REDACTED] had one and SPC [REDACTED] had one and [REDACTED] SGT [REDACTED] came walking with them. They asked if we were going to throw them in the water with their hands tied up and I said hell no, cut them loose. So I told one guy, the skinny guy to jump and he didn't so I kicked him in the butt and told him to jump and he still didn't. And somehow during all that commotion I believe that [REDACTED] pushed him off the bridge and right when I was about to look over the edge I got bum rushed from my left side so I turned around and grabbed a hold of [REDACTED] because I thought that he was going to fall too and that's when the chunky guy was in the water. After that everybody went back to the Bradley's and me and [REDACTED] saw the chunky guy swim to the shore and the skinny guy was still on the water saying something and that's when me and [REDACTED] went back to the Bradley's. When we got back to Brassfield I heard that the white truck the guys were in was crushed by a Bradley and that was it for the night. A couple of days had gone by when the LT came to talk to me about that night. He said that it's gotten big, that the Iraqi's send an e-mail saying that we killed this man in the river and that we must not tell nobody about this, because the CO could lose his company and the LT could lose the platoon and who knows what else might happen. So the next day they told us that CID wanted to talk to us about it but we had to stick to the story that we dropped them off on the road. The LT, CO, plt SGT, and a Maj, took us back to the bridge during daylight hours to find out what really happened. So we told him and my LT jumps in the water to see how deep it is and they said it was impossible for those for those two guys to be saying the truth when the LT and SFC [REDACTED] saw them out of the water. So they told us again to stick to the story because CID is bad, they are out to get us and that everybody knew the truth but they are out to get us.

Q: Did you hear anyone say anything about throwing any curfew violators into the water earlier in the night?

A: Not just curfew violators, but he said we were going to pick someone up for a swim.

Q: Who?

A: The LT.

Q: Did anyone else hear this?

A: I don't know.

Q: Explain to me exactly what was said and by whom when the convoy stopped and the detainees were off loaded?

A: Before we got to the bridge, we stopped once and off loaded. But we were told to get back on and we drove again for a few minutes. This is when we had the detainees exited the vehicle. We were all standing outside the Bradley and looked up to the LT, who was standing in the turret. This is when he said if we were not comfortable with throwing them over the bridge we could throw them by the shore. Nothing else was said.

Q: Who heard the LT order you guys to throw them into the water? b6-5, b7c-5

A: I don't know who else heard it other than me, but [REDACTED] were standing there also. I think [REDACTED] was still in the Bradley.

Q: Explain to me how many people were in your vehicle and who got out?

INVESTIGATIVE/OPERATIONAL SUMMARY: Investigation was initiated on 13 Jan 04, when it was reported from Forward Operating Base (FOB) Brassfield, Samarra, Iraq, of an alleged murder of an Iraqi national by American forces. Preliminary investigation revealed Mr. [REDACTED] Samarra, Iraq (NFI), reported to the Iraqi Civil Defense Corp (ICDC) on 3 Jan 04, that he and his cousin, Mr. Zaydun Ma'mun FADHIL, Samarra, Iraq (NFI) were detained by the American forces which resulted in the death of Mr. FADHIL.

Further investigation revealed that Mr. [REDACTED] approached the ICDC security check point in Samarra, late in the evening of 3 Jan 04 or early in the morning of 4 Jan 04, and reported he and Mr. FADHIL were stopped, searched and later detained by the American Forces. He reported that after they were detained they were both pushed off of a bridge into a river and Mr. FADHIL apparently drowned.

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Attached as Exhibit is Polygraph Examination Report (DA Form 2802). This exhibit will be destroyed not later than 3 months after the date of the report of investigation (para 2-6H, AR 195-6). The original, to include related polygraph records, is at the U.S. Army Crime Records Center, USACIDC, 6010 6th Street, Ft. Belvoir, VA 22060-5585. Reproduction of this exhibit or its contents is prohibited.

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On 16 Jan 04, Mr. [REDACTED] was interviewed by USACIDC and stated he and Mr. FADHIL were returning from Baghdad, where they had purchased some plumbing supplies. He stated that about 2230, 3 Jan 04, while traveling to their home in Samarra, they arrived at the ICDC check point. Mr. [REDACTED] stated at the check point their vehicle was searched, their identifications cards were checked, and they were allowed to proceed. However, they were instructed to immediately go to their residences as the curfew was nearing (2300). Mr. [REDACTED] said they departed the checkpoint and about 2 or 3 kilometers away they approached an oncoming American convoy. He said the Americans stopped their vehicle and instructed them to exit the vehicle. According to Mr. [REDACTED] their vehicle was searched, they were personally searched and then they were handcuffed and placed in the rear of a military vehicle, later identified as a Bradley Fighting Vehicle (BFV). Mr. [REDACTED] stated they were never informed why they were being detained but were released before the vehicle drove away. He said they got back into their vehicle and drove about 20 meters, when the same soldiers once again stopped them, handcuffed them again and placed them in the back of the BFV. Mr. [REDACTED] indicated the BFV drove away and about 15 minutes later it stopped and they were ordered to exit the vehicle, and once he got out of the vehicle he could see the lights from the ICDC check point and they were un-cuffed and instructed to stand near the bridge. Mr. [REDACTED] stated once they stood near the bridge, the soldiers instructed them to jump off of it and when they did not a soldier approached MR FADHIL and pushed him off into the water and soon after he also was pushed into the water. Mr. [REDACTED] said when he went into the water he could hear Mr. FADHIL screaming because he did not know how to swim, but he was unable to get to him due to the strong currents in the water. Mr. [REDACTED] stated he swam to the shore and hid because he could hear the soldiers laughing about the incident. Mr. [REDACTED] described the soldier that pushed Mr. FADHIL as skinny, not very tall and his skin was a little darker than white. He was unable to describe the soldier that pushed him into the water and was not sure if it was the same person or another soldier standing near by. Mr. [REDACTED] stated once the soldiers departed he made his way back to the ICDC check point and reported the incident to the Iraqi guards, who went back to the river with him to assist in the search of Mr. FADHIL. He stated they could not find him and he spent the remainder of the night at the ICDC area. The next morning when he returned to his vehicle he discovered it had been destroyed by unknown means. Photographs were exposed of the vehicle by a friend and the local community continued to search for the body of Mr. FADHIL. The photographs of the vehicle were obtained by USACIDC, and a review of the prints depicts enormous damage to the vehicle and a trailer, apparently caused by a BFV running completely over it.

On 15 Jan 04, the remains of Mr. FADHIL were apparently discovered by the local nationals and he was soon thereafter buried in a local cemetery. Photographs were also exposed of the human remains. According to Mr. [REDACTED], Mr. FADHIL had injuries to his head and facial area caused by unknown means. Photographs of the human remains have not yet been collected by USACIDC to confirm the identity of the human remains in relation to Mr. FADHIL.

Additional investigative activities resulted in the identification of the soldiers involved in this incident. This was accomplished by obtaining historical data of particular units and their

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mission for that particular date and location. As a result of this investigative activity, the particular soldiers involved were interviewed and all denied any wrongdoing pertaining to this investigation.

Eight soldiers were identified as being at the scene and interviewed, three under rights advisement. One of the soldiers interviewed, SSG [REDACTED] A Company, 1/8th Infantry, stated they stopped the vehicle because of a curfew violation and the Iraqi's were detained. He stated he did not exit his vehicle but heard what was transpiring over the radio and that he called the 1LT to request permission to run over the detainee's vehicle with his BFV. According to SSG [REDACTED], he was denied permission and the convoy proceeded with the detainees in the front BFV, and their vehicle left behind undamaged. SSG [REDACTED] related that a few minutes later the convoy stopped and he heard the detainees were being released because of a shortage at the detention facility. SSG [REDACTED] said as the convoy drove away he observed the two detainees standing near the bridge. SSG [REDACTED] denied he witnessed, assisted, or conspired with anyone to throw the two detainees into the river. He also denied he or anyone else in the convoy drove over the detainee's vehicle with their BFV.

On 16 Jan 04, 1LT [REDACTED] A Company, 1/8th Infantry, was interviewed and denied any wrongdoing pertaining to this investigation. 1LT [REDACTED] stated his unit was returning from their nightly patrols and stopped a vehicle that contained two Iraqi's for a curfew violation. He stated SGT [REDACTED] reported to him that one of the individuals had a false identification card as the photograph appeared to be that of a younger individual. 1LT [REDACTED] ordered that the two Iraqi's be detained and placed in the rear of their BFV. He said that once they were moving again, with the two detainees, he realized the detention facility was closed so he stopped and ordered SGT [REDACTED] to remove the flexi-cuffs and release the detainees. 1LT [REDACTED] said once that was accomplished they began rolling out and he looked in the mirror and observed the two detainees standing on the north side of the road as the convoy drove away. 1LT [REDACTED] denied he ordered, witnessed, or had any knowledge of the two detainees being thrown into the river.

The other three soldiers (SGT [REDACTED], SGT [REDACTED], and SPC [REDACTED]) all of A company, 1/8th Infantry, were interviewed and denied having any knowledge of wrongdoing pertaining to this investigation. Each of them were in the back of another BFV and apparently never dismounted their vehicle.

On 16 Jan 04, three members of the ICDC on duty the night of the incident were interviewed. They were, PFC [REDACTED] (NFI); PFC [REDACTED] (NFI); and CPL [REDACTED] (NFI). Each of them stated they recalled the two Iraqi's coming through their check point and being cleared by themselves. They stated that about 15 minutes after releasing the vehicle they observed an American convoy stop near the bridge and remain there for about 5 minutes. They were unable to see any specific acts or movements and were unable to hear what was being said, although they said they could hear some talking. They stated that about 5 minutes after the convoy departed they observed an

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individual approaching their check point, later identified as Mr. [REDACTED] ^{Wb-4/67C-4}. They said he was soaking wet and informed them that the Americans had thrown himself and Mr. FADHIL from the bridge into the water. Members of the ICDC assisted in a search for Mr. FADHIL, but were unable to locate the body.

On 16 Jan 04, SPC [REDACTED] A Company, 1/8th Infantry [REDACTED] was interviewed under rights advisement and denied any wrongdoing pertaining to this investigation. SPC [REDACTED] stated after the two Iraqi's were detained they drove a while and then the convoy stopped. SPC [REDACTED] stated they were directed to release the two detainees, so he, SGT [REDACTED] and SPC [REDACTED] A Company, 1/8th Infantry (27 Jul 79, Lima, OH), exited the BFV with the two detainees. He stated SGT [REDACTED] supervised, SPC [REDACTED] provided him with the knife and then pulled security, while he [REDACTED] removed the cuffs from the two detainees. SPC [REDACTED] stated that after the cuffs were removed, SGT [REDACTED] told the two detainees to leave, and the three of them got back inside the BFV and departed. He said the last time he saw the two detainees, they were walking along the side of the road.

On 16 Jan 04, SPC [REDACTED] was interviewed under rights advisement and denied any wrongdoing pertaining to this investigation. SPC [REDACTED] stated after they had detained the two Iraqi's, the convoy stopped and they were instructed to release the two detainees. He said SPC [REDACTED] SGT [REDACTED] and himself exited the BFV, while he pulled security, SPC [REDACTED] removed the cuffs, and SGT [REDACTED] supervised. He stated they escorted the two detainees near the bridge on the right side of the road, removed the cuffs, and SGT [REDACTED] told them (the detainees) to leave. SPC [REDACTED] stated the last time he saw the two detainees they were standing on the side of the road as the convoy departed.

On 16 Jan 04, SGT [REDACTED] was interviewed under rights advisement and denied any wrongdoing pertaining to this investigation. SGT [REDACTED] stated they stopped the vehicle for a curfew violation and during a search they discovered one of them had a false identification card. It was then decided to detain the two Iraqi's. SGT [REDACTED] stated they loaded the two Iraqi's into the BFV and departed. He said about 15 minutes after leaving they stopped the vehicles and 1LT [REDACTED] told him to release the detainees; so he, SPC [REDACTED] and SPC [REDACTED] exited the vehicle, removed the cuffs, and left the two Iraqi's standing on the side of the road. SGT [REDACTED] stated that when he got back into the BFV, the two Iraqi's were still standing on the side of the road. He also stated he did not know they were located near a river or bridge, because it was dark and he couldn't see. It should be noted that there was a light near the bridge and the ICDC checkpoint had numerous lights illuminating the immediate area, and others interviewed were aware of the bridge being there. SGT [REDACTED] matches the description provided by the surviving victim of the individual that pushed Mr. FADHIL from the bridge. SGT [REDACTED] continued to deny he pushed either of the two Iraqi's into the river, denied he observed either of the two Iraqi's being pushed into the river, and denied he planned with any members of his unit to conceal the act of pushing the two Iraqi's into the river. SGT [REDACTED] was offered the opportunity to undergo a polygraph examination to verify the truthfulness of his statement, to which he agreed.

Around the 6-7 Jan 04, 1/66 Armor Commander [REDACTED] contacted me and told me he was notified by the city counsel that US Forces had forced Iraqi's to jump into the Tigris river and one of them had drowned. The next day, I informed the commanding general when he visited that I was aware of this allegation and I didn't believe it was true but that I started a commander's inquiry. He directed me to get CID involved in the investigation. I then contacted CPT [REDACTED] and informed her of the allegation and that for her to contact CID and have an investigation started. I met with CPT [REDACTED] I believe on 8 Jan 04. The next city counsel meeting was a few days later and after that meeting, I met with the alleged survivor and the ICDC personnel that were at the checkpoint the night of the alleged incident. There was an interpreter available and through him I got the victim's verbal statement of what had occurred. The victim said he was picked up and rode around in a Bradley on the night in question. He said they were then taken to the river and him and his cousin were motioned by the soldiers to jump into the river. He stated he knew his cousin couldn't swim and that's why he didn't want to jump. He stated his cousin was pushed first into the river and then he was also pushed. He went into how he tried to help his cousin and he couldn't and he believed that his cousin drowned. He then went to the ICDC checkpoint and reported what happened. I then spoke to the ICDC personnel and then pretty much had the same story on what the Victim said. They did see the victim walk towards the checkpoint and he was wet and muddy and told them the same story he told me. A couple of days after that meeting, I was at FOB Braddfield/Mora and I requested to speak directly with the Platoon Sergeant, SFC [REDACTED]. He came to speak with me with the Company Commander, CPT [REDACTED]. I asked SFC [REDACTED] if he had been read his rights and he said yes and I asked him a question about the incident, I don't remember exactly what I asked him, but he said that he was the last vehicle in the convoy and he stated that when he was departing the incident scene, the two Iraqi's were standing on the side of the road facing each other. At no time did anyone tell me that an Iraqi had actually been pushed and then was seen on the side of the road. I only found out that an Iraqi had been pushed as a result of this investigation and the confessions CID has received.

Preliminary investigation revealed Mr. [REDACTED], Samarra, Iraq (NFI), reported to the Iraqi Civil Defense Corp (ICDC) on 3 Jan 04, that he and his cousin, Mr. Zaydun Ma'mun FADHIL, Samarra, Iraq (NFI) were detained by the American forces which resulted in the death of Mr. FADHIL.

Further investigation revealed that Mr. [REDACTED] approached the ICDC security check point in Samarra, late in the evening of 3 Jan 04 or early in the morning of 4 Jan 04, and reported he and Mr. FADHIL were stopped, searched and later detained by the American Forces. He reported that after they were detained they were both pushed off of a bridge into a river and Mr. Fadhill apparently drowned.

On 16 Jan 04, Mr. [REDACTED] was interviewed by USACIDC and stated he and Mr. FADHIL were returning from Baghdad, where they had purchased some plumbing supplies. He stated that about 2230, 3 Jan 04, while traveling to their home in Samarra, they arrived at the ICDC checkpoint. Mr. [REDACTED] stated at the checkpoint their vehicle was searched, their identifications cards were checked, and they were allowed to proceed. However, they were instructed to immediately go to their residences the curfew was nearing (2300). Mr. [REDACTED] said they departed the checkpoint and about 2 or 3 kilometers away they approached an oncoming American convoy. He said the Americans stopped their vehicle and instructed them to exit the vehicle. According to Mr. [REDACTED], their vehicle was searched, they were personally searched and then they were handcuffed and placed in the rear of a military vehicle, later identified as a Bradley Fighting Vehicle (BFV). Mr. [REDACTED] stated they were never informed why they were being detained but were released before the vehicle drove away. He said they got back into their vehicle and drove about 20 meters, when the same soldiers once again stopped them, handcuffed them again and placed them in the back of the BFV. Mr. [REDACTED] indicated the BFV drove away and about 15 minutes later it stopped and they were ordered to exit the vehicle, and once he got out of the vehicle he could see the lights from the ICDC checkpoint and they were un-cuffed and instructed to stand near the bridge. Mr. [REDACTED] stated once they stood near the bridge, the soldiers instructed them to jump off of it and when they did not a soldier approached MR. FADHIL and pushed him off into the water and soon after he also was pushed into the water. Mr. [REDACTED] said when he went into the water he could hear Mr. FADHIL screaming because he did not know how to swim, but he was unable to get to him due to the strong currents in the water. Mr. [REDACTED] stated he swam to the shore and hid because he could hear the soldiers laughing about the incident. Mr. [REDACTED] described the soldier that pushed Mr. FADHIL as skinny, not very tall and his skin was a little darker than white. He was unable to describe the soldier that pushed him into the water and was not sure if it was the same person or another soldier standing near by. Mr. [REDACTED] stated once the soldiers departed he made his way back to the ICDC checkpoint and reported the incident to the Iraqi guards, who went back to the river with him to assist in the search of Mr. FADHIL. He stated they could not find him and he spent the remainder of the night at the ICDC area. The next morning when he returned to his vehicle he discovered it had been destroyed by unknown means. Photographs were exposed of the vehicle by a friend and the local community continued to search for the body of Mr. FADHIL. The photographs of the vehicle were obtained by USACIDC, and a review of the prints depict enormous damage to the vehicle and a trailer, apparently caused by a BFV running completely over it.

A Company, 1/8th Inf, was identified as the unit having contact with the two Iraqi's in question. Unit members were interviewed and described detaining, and subsequently releasing, these two individuals but denied injuring or causing injury to either person.

On 20 and 21 Jan 04 three A Co. unit members underwent polygraph examinations. All three rendered sworn statements wherein they detailed their involvement in throwing the two men into the water and how their chain of command ordered them to deny doing so. Specifically, one soldier stated 1LT [REDACTED], CPT [REDACTED] and MAJ [REDACTED] had knowledge of the men being thrown into the water and that they were involved in covering up this incident.

He did not specify who provided him the information pertaining to COL [REDACTED]. Another soldier identified CPT [REDACTED] as being aware of these facts, but was not aware of anyone else higher in his chain of command being involved in or having any knowledge of this incident. The third soldier identified Major [REDACTED] and LTC [REDACTED] as being involved. This soldier reported that he and the other two unit members involved had not spoken with COL [REDACTED] about this incident but he was told by members of his chain of command that they (referring to the [REDACTED]) knew everything. He was unable to specifically identify who made these comments.

On 22 Jan 04, 1LT [REDACTED] was interviewed under rights advisement and denied any wrongdoing pertaining to this investigation. 1LT [REDACTED] did not discuss anything about COL [REDACTED] having knowledge of this incident.

On 25 Jan 04, CPT [REDACTED] was advised of his legal rights which he invoked, electing not to be questioned about the incident. He did not discuss anything pertaining to COL [REDACTED] knowledge or involvement in this investigation.

On 25 Jan 04, MAJ [REDACTED] HHC, 1/8th Infantry Battalion, was interviewed under rights advisement and continued to deny any wrongdoing pertaining to this investigation. Major [REDACTED] is the [REDACTED] and was specifically identified in statements as being aware of the incident and being directly involved in the false information initially reported. Major [REDACTED] did not provide any information regarding COL [REDACTED] knowledge of or involvement in this investigation.

On 27 Jan 04, LTC [REDACTED] HHC, 1/8th Infantry Battalion, Ft. Carson, CO, was interviewed under rights advisement and admitted he was made aware of the two Iraqi's being thrown into the water from CPT [REDACTED] and 1LT [REDACTED]. He stated he instructed everyone involved to say they released the Iraqi's on the side of the road, instead of describing how they were thrown into the water. LTC [REDACTED] did say that he was not aware of the possibility that one of the Iraqi's drowned, as he was told that both men were seen on the roadside when the convoy departed. LTC [REDACTED] stated to his knowledge Major [REDACTED] and COL [REDACTED] were not involved in this incident from any perspective.

On 29 Jan 04 all members of the 1st platoon that were present on the night of this incident were interviewed and either denied having any knowledge or elected not to speak about the incident. None of the soldiers indicated COL [REDACTED] had any knowledge and/or involvement in this investigation.

On 29 Jan 04, 1SG [REDACTED] A Company, 1/8th Infantry, was interviewed and stated he was first informed about the incident through his Commander, CPT [REDACTED].

Although, ISG [REDACTED] stated he instructed the Commander to not tell him any details, as someone had to remain in control of the remainder of the unit. ISG [REDACTED] claimed he had no knowledge of the incident or of any cover up until the CID investigation was initiated. Also, ISG [REDACTED] stated to his knowledge COL [REDACTED] had no involvement in the incident or the actions taken afterwards.

On 29 Jan 04, CSM [REDACTED] 586-66-1015, HHC, 1/8th Infantry, was interviewed and denied having any knowledge pertaining to this incident. CSM stated once he heard the rumors of the incident he approached LTC [REDACTED] to question what was going on and he was told by him to not be concerned with it and stay out of it. CSM [REDACTED] stated to his knowledge, COL [REDACTED] was not involved in any phase of the incident.

On 29 Jan 04, SGM [REDACTED] 3d Brigade Combat Team, was interviewed and denied having any involvement pertaining to this investigation. Also, CSM [REDACTED] stated to his knowledge COL [REDACTED] did not have any prior knowledge pertaining to the two men being thrown into the river and that he did not have any involvement in the actions taken by certain members to conceal information after the incident.

On 27 Jan 04, COL [REDACTED] was interviewed under rights advisement and denied any wrongdoing pertaining to this investigation. COL [REDACTED] stated he initially heard of the incident when he was notified by the local city counsel of the allegations that US Forces had forced Iraqi's to jump into the river. COL [REDACTED] stated he briefed the Commanding General, 4th Infantry Division, Tikrit, Iraq, the next day, telling him he did not believe it was true but that he had initiated a commander's inquiry, and that the CG had instructed him to get CID involved. COL [REDACTED] stated that at the next city counsel meeting, he spoke with the surviving victim and the ICDC personnel, who all told him about the two being thrown into the water. COL [REDACTED] said a few days later he spoke with CPT [REDACTED] and SFC [REDACTED] and was never told about anyone being pushed into the water, saying he discovered they were pushed as a result of the CID interviews of his soldiers. Although LTC [REDACTED] denies informing COL [REDACTED] about the offense as it occurred and about the plan to cover the truth, it is believed COL [REDACTED] was informed about the incident prior to his being briefed about the results of the USACIDC interviews. COL [REDACTED] continued to deny that he had any knowledge of the two men being thrown into the water (prior to the confession to USACIDC), denied any of his subordinates informed him that the two men were forced into the water, and denied planning with anyone to distort the truth about the two men being thrown into the water. COL [REDACTED] was offered the opportunity to undergo a polygraph examination to verify the truthfulness of his statement, to which he agreed.

Due to the death of one of our Company Commanders from a recent mortar attack, the Battalion Commander was unable to conduct a formal Commander's Inquiry into this incident—he was in Balad, while I stayed in Samarra. So, I questioned several soldiers from 1st Platoon, A Company. Following my questioning, I was to report back to him on what I found and what I think happened. As instructed, I spoke first to LT [REDACTED] and SFC [REDACTED] about this incident and had them explain to me in great detail the event from the time they first detained the two Iraqi males to the point they released them, and what was the LAST thing each of them saw as they drove away in their M2A2 Bradleys. The next day after my questioning of the platoon leader and platoon sergeant, I accompanied the entire first platoon, A Company back to the proposed site that they released the two Iraqi male detainees. I had the soldiers replay the exact events that happened that night to include where they stood and what they saw from their vantage point that night. Then, I had the Platoon Leader show me what he saw from his Bradley as he drove away, which was the two males standing apart from each other. As the Platoon Sergeant drove away, as the last vehicle in the patrol facing to the rear, he saw both males facing each other, approximately 10 feet from where LT [REDACTED] saw them moments earlier. They were facing each other and talking. Based off of these verbal statements and seeing the location, I believed what the Platoon Leader and Platoon Sergeant told me. I reported back to the Battalion and Brigade Commander that I honestly believed, based off of what the members of 1st platoon told me, and based on the verbal statements from the platoon leader and platoon sergeant, that neither of the male detainees drown during that incident.

I was conducting a Commanders inquiry and wanted to check all possibilities. [REDACTED] b6-5, b7c-5

A: Only off what they were accused of, they were accused of pushing them into the water and that is the only thing I was aware of. I returned back to Samarra (Brassfield-Mora) on the day of CPT Paliwoda's memorial service (7 JAN 04). As most know, Eric's death deeply affected me. In the days afterward, I was definitely not myself - basically having one of my Company Commanders die in my presence - had left me pretty much grief stricken and very upset. It also bothered me a great deal that Eric died on Paliwoda FOB (formerly Eagle) while 1-8 IN was still in Samarra. Anyway, I was still pretty upset when CPT [redacted] and [redacted] approached me with a report of the incident in Samarra.

I needed to meet the Bde Cdr and the 1-66 AR Cdr for a transition meeting since I was returning back to Balad the next day to relieve 2-3 Infantry. So, in a 10 minute meeting or so, CPT [redacted] relayed to me the events that on the night of 3 JAN 04, 1st Platoon, A Company had detained [redacted]

2 individuals breaking curfew up near the SDI Complex in Samarra, however, instead of moving them to the CMOC or police station across from the CMOC, they moved the 2 detainees to a location just past checkpoint K2 and had them get out of the Bradley, they uncuffed the detainees, and motioned to have the 2 individuals jump into the nearby water - the 2 Iraqis did just that and then soldiers watched as the Iraqis got out of the water and walked away. The soldiers then remounted their Bradleys and continued movement back to Brassfield-Mora.

As a result of this information, I made a poor, hasty decision to have everyone involved just talk about dropping the Iraqis off on the road. First, I was clearly not myself - still focused on the mortar attacks in Balad, Eric, and finding his killers. Second, I thought the water was inconsequential since the soldiers had watched them get out. I was very upset with the platoon's leadership, their poor judgement/actions, and wanted to handle this at my level.

CPT [REDACTED] is my best Company Commander and A Company is my best infantry company. Well-trained, organized, effective, and aggressive, A Company has done a phenomenal job in both phases of engagement. Eliminating attackers while also engaging

in a highly successful civil affairs campaign in Balad. So, I told the Company Cdr and Platoon leader to not mention anything about the water. And then I left the next day for Balad and basically took my "eye off the ball" in Samarra since we launched into several consecutive operations to capture/detain CPT [REDACTED]'s Killers - b7C-4, b6-4 and by the time I came out of those operations - CID was involved, the investigation was on-going, and everything was clearly out of my hands. And so, though I am quite sure [REDACTED] is alive and well - it has come to this. b6-4, b7C-4

I have made hundreds of decisions out here in combat - many split-second under fire, many that fall into the "life or death" category, and many on the future of detainees (release or hold). In all cases, I know I have made the right call - but in this instance, I did not.

I do not excuse the behavior of those involved in having the Iraqis jump into the water - it was an act of stupidity, but no one drowned - and hopefully in two weeks or so I will be able to detain [REDACTED] b6-4, b7C-4 and prove that.

I also do not excuse my decision - of the hundreds of right calls I have made, this one was wrong - no matter that I was still suffering

PRELIMINARY INVESTIGATION DISCLOSED MR. [REDACTED] ^{b7C-4, b6-4} REPORTED TO THE IRAQI CIVIL DEFENSE CORP (ICDC) AT A CHECK POINT IN SAMARRA THAT HE AND MR. FADHIL, HIS COUSIN, WERE DETAINED BY US AMERICAN SOLDIERS WHILE ON THEIR WAY HOME FROM BAGHDAD, FOR REASONS UNKNOWN, AND TRANSPORTED A SHORT DISTANCE, THEN RELEASED AT A BRIDGE APPROXIMATELY 15 MINUTES LATER.
