





INTERROGATION

Interrogation is the process of questioning a source to obtain the maximum amount of reliable information, that answer the commander's priority intelligence requirements (PIR), in a minimum amount of time.

INTELLIGENCE INTERROGATION

Any intelligence interrogation must go through five phases in order to be a successful exploitation method.

Interrogators must understand the importance of each phase and when and how to transition from phase to another.

Each phase is a unique process that has its purpose and contribution to the final intelligence interrogation value.

- 1. Planning and Preparation
- 2. Approaches
- 3. Questioning
- 4. Termination
- 5. Reporting

PLANNING & PREPARATION PHASE

This is the first phase of any interrogation and must be done with attention to detail in order to be successful.

1. Develop an Interrogation Plan

- 3. Analyze Information
- 4. Select Approaches
- 5. Finalize the Plan





QUESTIONING PHASE

The questioning phase begins when the source answers questions pertinent to the interrogation objectives/PIR's.

TERMINATION PHASE

The primary purpose of the termination phase is to prepare the source for <u>further questioning</u>.
