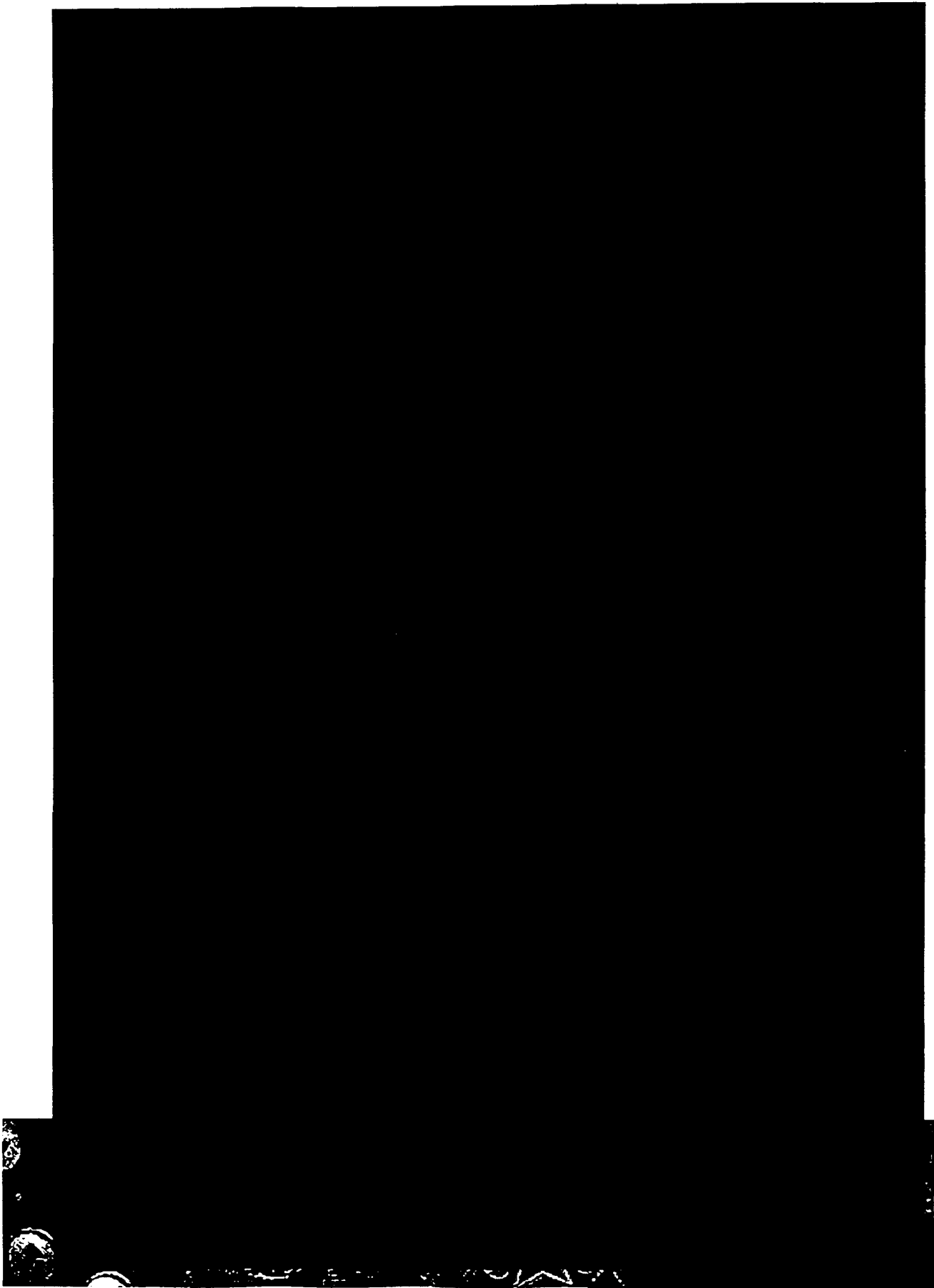


Purpose

Interrogation is the art of questioning an EPW to obtain actionable and reliable information, in a lawful manner within the least amount of time possible, which meets the intelligence requirements of the supported command.

Coordination

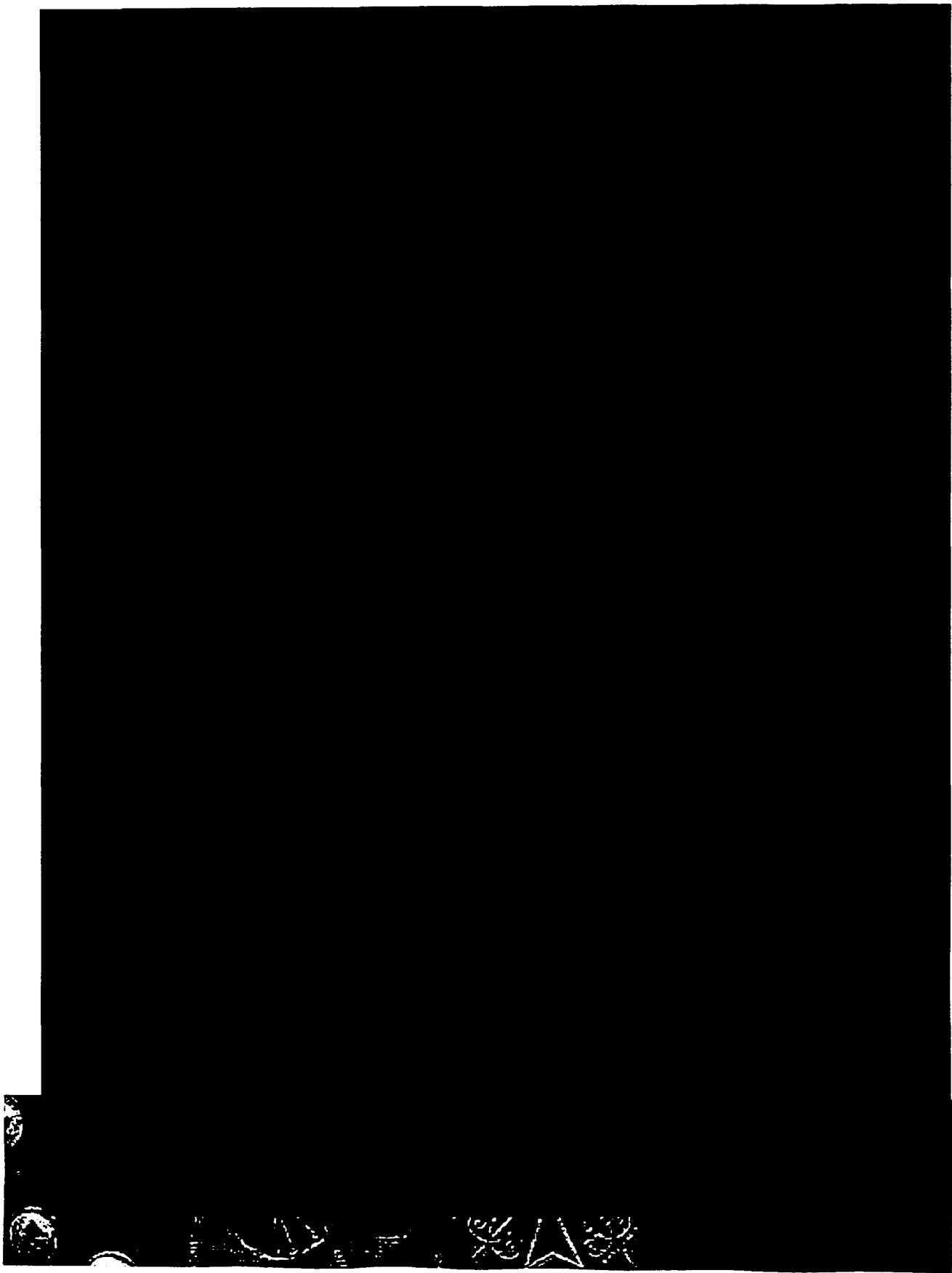

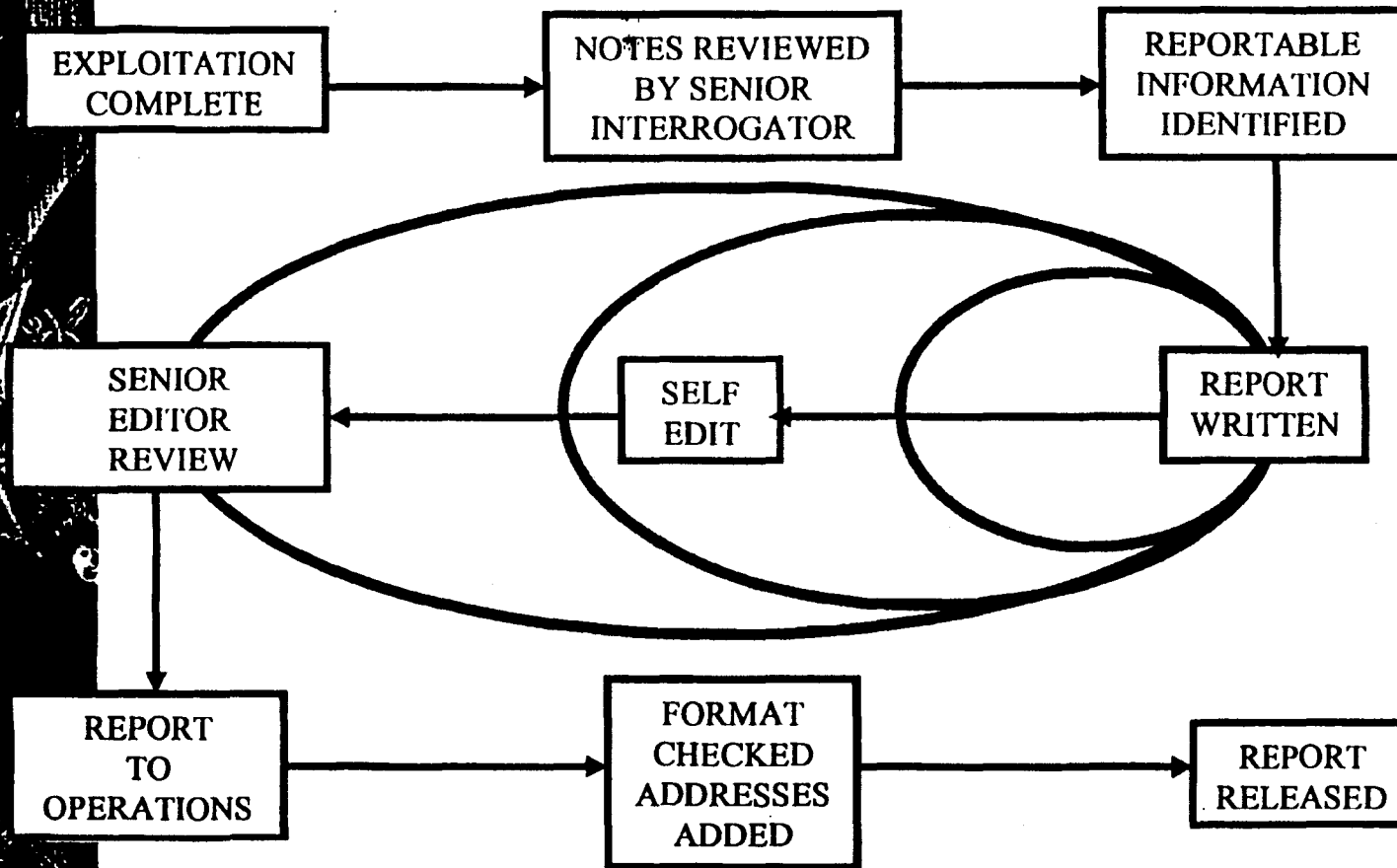


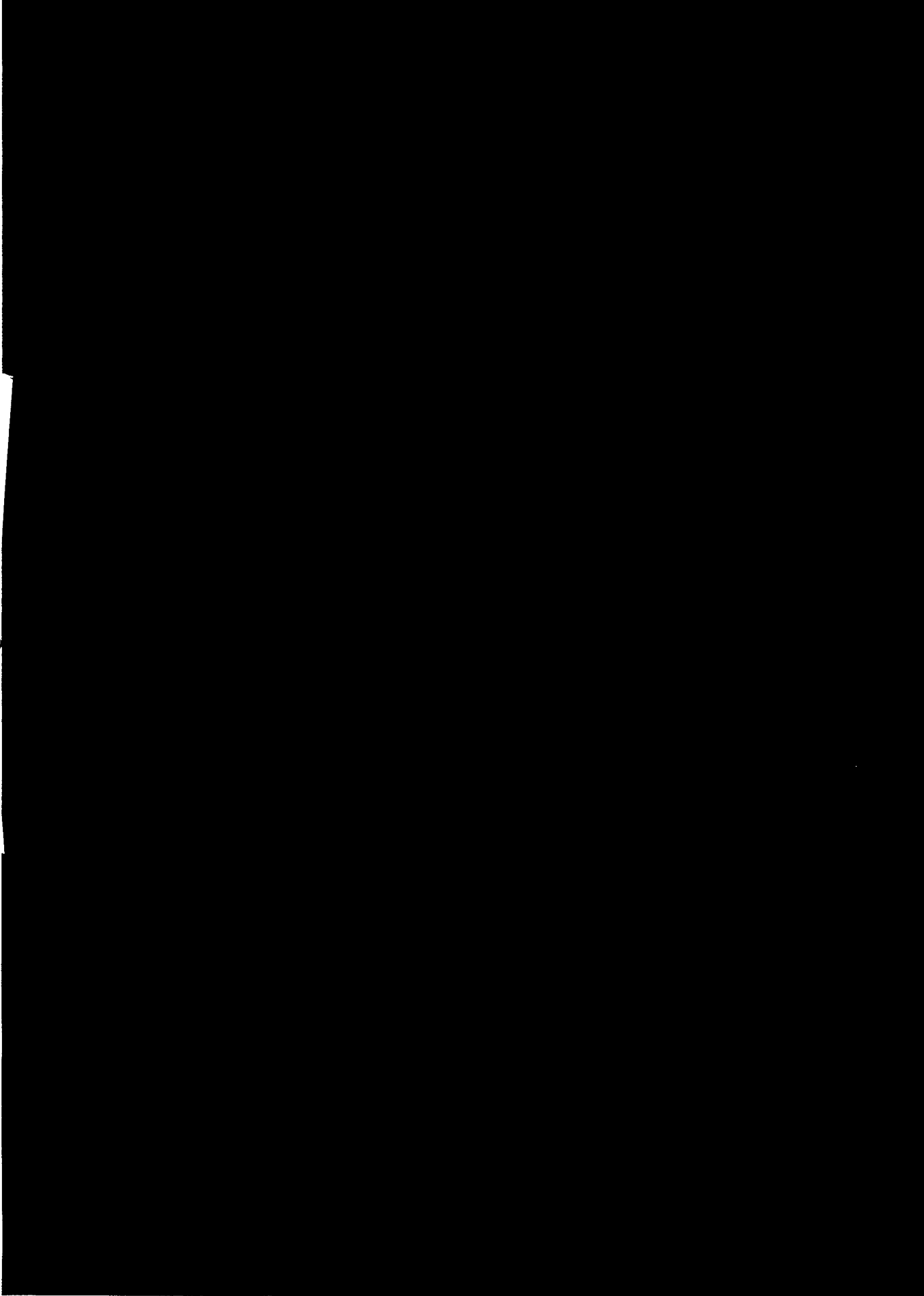






Reporting Cycle

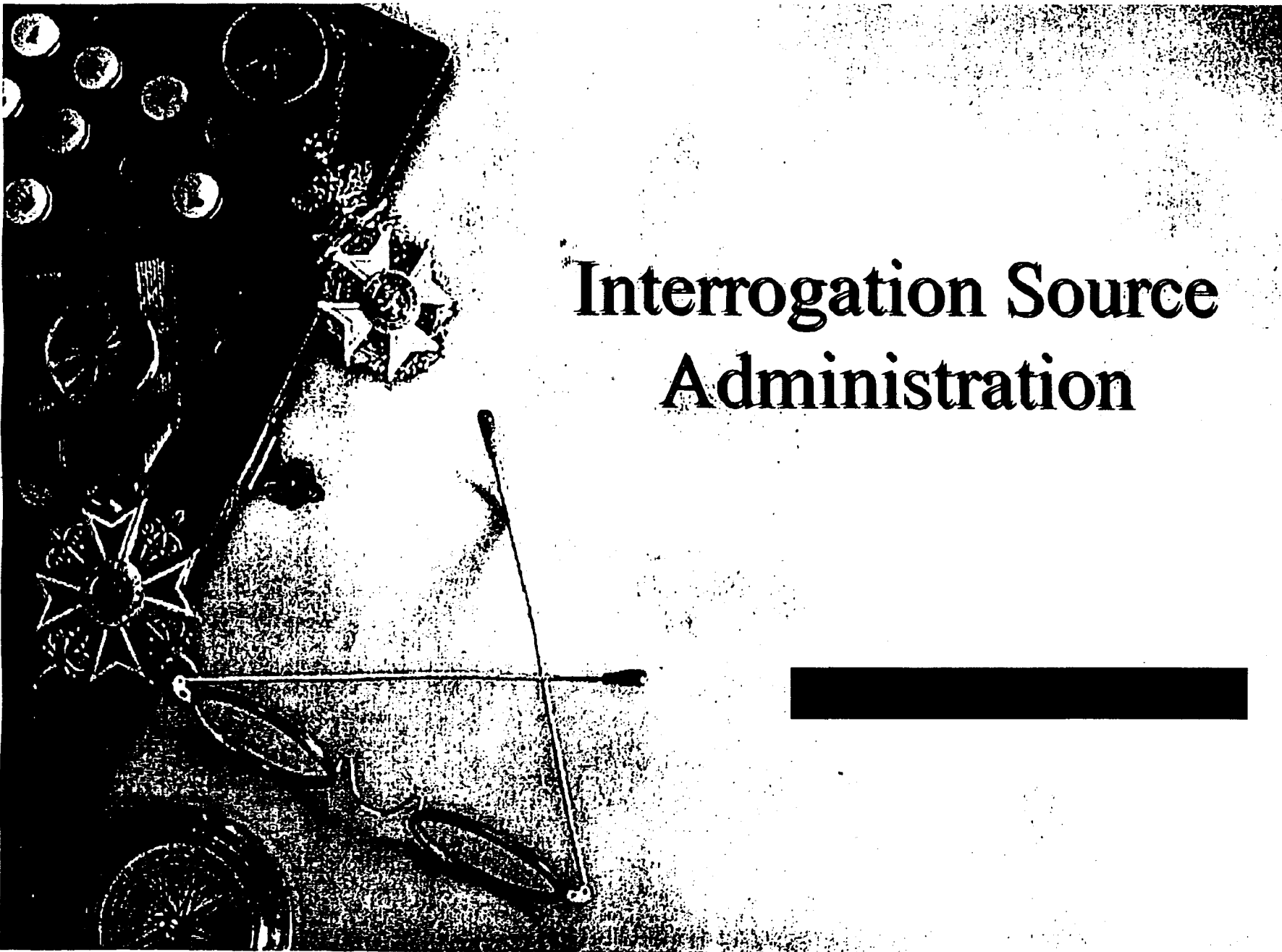

INTERROGATION

Interrogation is the process of questioning a source to obtain the maximum amount of reliable information, that answer the commander's priority intelligence requirements (PIR), in a minimum amount of time.

INTELLIGENCE INTERROGATION

Any intelligence interrogation must go through five phases in order to be a successful exploitation method.

Interrogators must understand the importance of each phase and when and how to transition from phase to another.

Each phase is a unique process that has its purpose and contribution to the final intelligence interrogation value.

Five Phases of Interrogation

1. Planning and Preparation
2. Approaches
3. Questioning
4. Termination
5. Reporting

PLANNING & PREPARATION PHASE

This is the first phase of any interrogation and must be done with attention to detail in order to be successful.

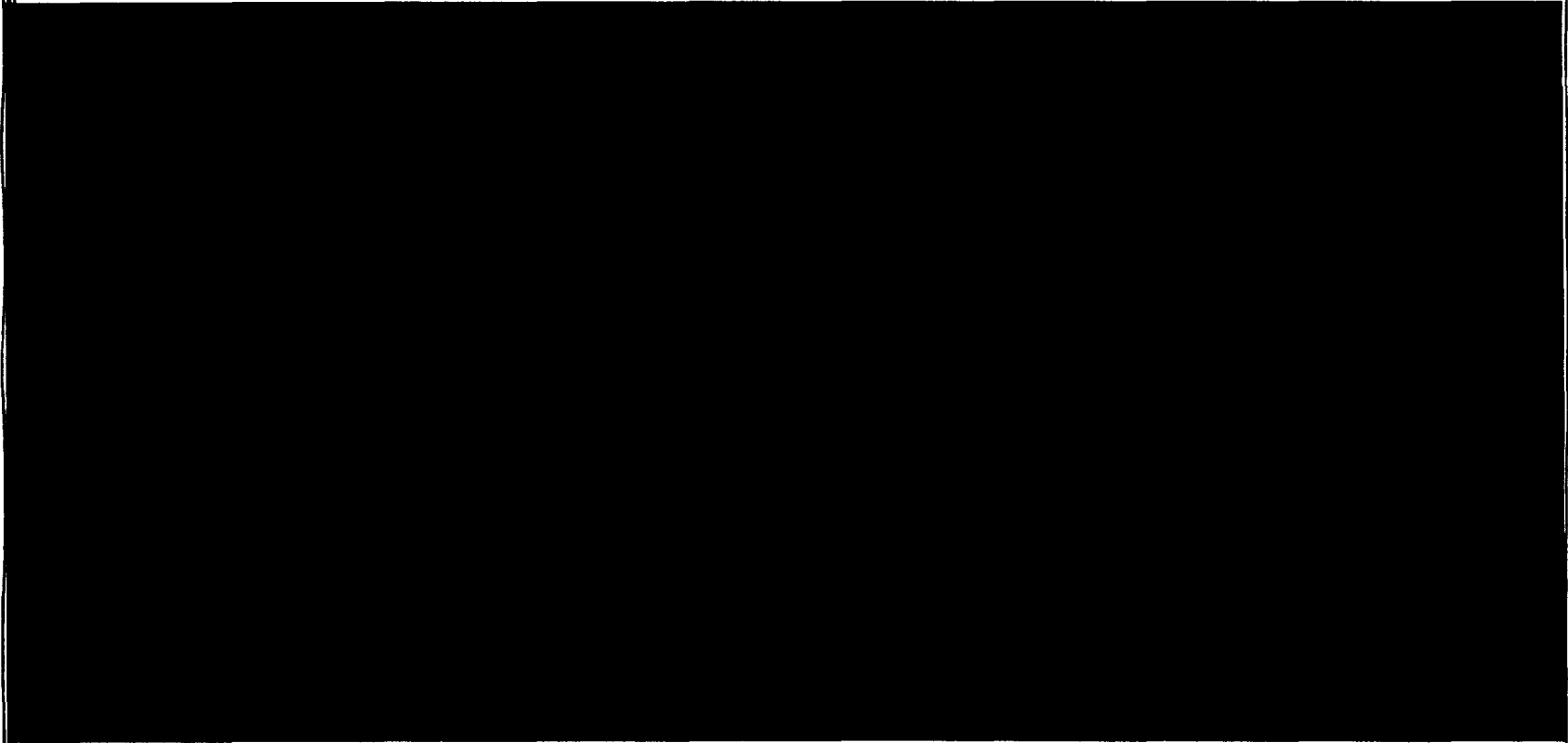

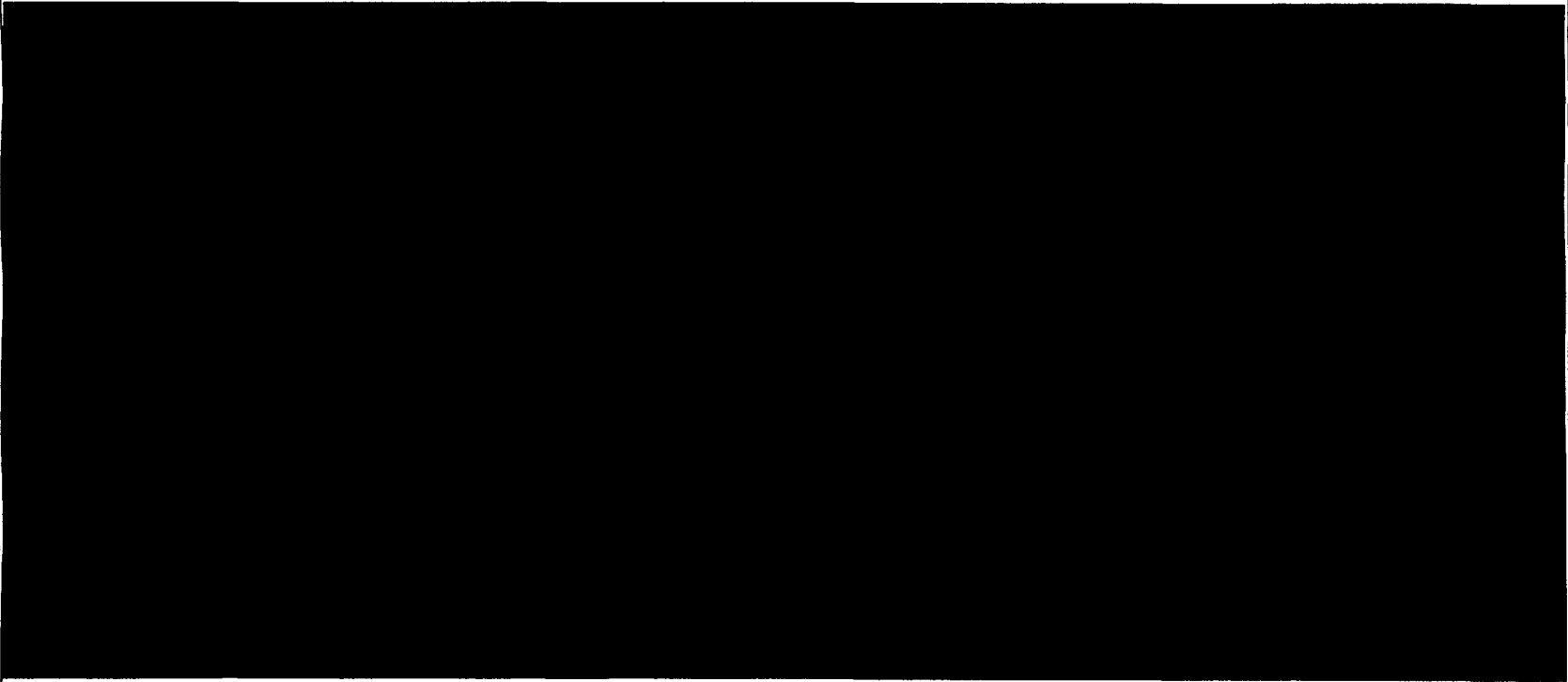

QUESTIONING PHASE

The questioning phase begins when the source answers questions pertinent to the interrogation objectives/PIR's.

Reinforce the approach or use the alternate approach if the source resists once again.

TERMINATION PHASE

The primary purpose of the termination phase is to prepare the source for further questioning.
