6. INVESTIGATIVE SUMMARY:

This is an Operation Iraqi Freedom investigation.

On 08 March 2004 this investigation was initiated based on
notification from the 22nd MP Battalion (CID), Baghdad
International Airport (BIAP), Baghdad, Iraq, APO AE 09342, that
a detainee from the Detention Facility, Camp Cropper, BIAP, IZ,
APO AE 09342 had died.

Investigation established probable cause to believe that Mr.
ABBAS died of Atherosclerotic Cardiovascular Disease while being
detained at the Detention Facility, Camp Cropper, BIAP, IZ, APO
AE 09342.

BASIS FOR INVESTIGATION: At 0930, 8 Mar 04, this office was notified by the 22nd Military Police (MP) Battalion (Bn), who received a Commander's Incident Report detailing the death of Mr Mohamad Abu ABBAS, Internment Serial Number (ISN) US 9IZ-200039CI, who was detained at Camp Cropper, Baghdad International Airport (BIAP), Baghdad, Iraq (IZ). At 1015, 8 Mar 04, SA [REDACTED] b7c-1, b6-1, b2, this office and the undersigned [REDACTED] b7c-3, b6-3 contacted and briefed this investigation with LTC [REDACTED] b7c-3, b6-3 Commander, High Value Detainee Confinement Center (HVDCC), Camp Cropper, BIAP, Baghdad, IZ.

At 1030, 8 Mar 04, SA [REDACTED] b7c-1, b6-1 and the undersigned [REDACTED] b7c-3, b6-3 contacted and briefed this investigation with CPT [REDACTED] b7c-3, b6-3 112th MP Bn, Camp Cropper, BIAP, Baghdad, IZ.

AGENT'S COMMENT: CPT [REDACTED] b7c-3, b6-3 provided a list of the detainees that were identified as being the roommates of Mr ABBAS. Due to the fact these roommates are considered High Value Detainees (HVD), coordination will have to be made with the Joint Interrogation Debriefing Center (JIDC), Camp Slayer, Baghdad, IZ, for authorization. At 1045, 8 Mar 04, SA [REDACTED] b7c-1, b6-1 and the undersigned [REDACTED] b7c-3, b6-3 contacted and briefed this investigation with LTC [REDACTED] b7c-3, b6-3 Commander, 112th MP Bn, Camp Cropper, BIAP, Baghdad, IZ.

AGENT'S COMMENT: CPT [REDACTED] b7c-3, b6-3 identified SPC [REDACTED] b7c-4, b6-4 439th MP Detachment (Det), Camp Cropper, SPC [REDACTED] b7c-4, b6-4 770th MP Company (CO), Camp Cropper, SGT [REDACTED] b7c-4, b6-4 B Co, 118th Medical Bn, BIAP, and Mr [REDACTED] b7c-4, b6-4 Translator, Camp Cropper, as personnel having significant information about this investigation. SPC [REDACTED] b7c-4, b6-4 was identified as being in direct contact with Mr ABBAS. SPC [REDACTED] b7c-4, b6-4 was informed by a detainee that Mr ABBAS was experiencing heart problems. SGT [REDACTED] b7c-4, b6-4 performed CPR on Mr ABBAS and Mr [REDACTED] b7c-4, b6-4 assisted in the treatment of Mr ABBAS.

[REDACTED] this office, interviewed COL (Dr) b7c-3, b6-3 447th Emergency Medical (EMED) Wing, United States Air Force (USAF), Camp Sather, IZ. COL b7c-3, b6-3 stated Mr ABBAS was transported to the EMED unit on Camp Sather, where he was later pronounced dead by COL b7c-3, b6-3 COL b7c-3, b6-3 stated Mr ABBAS was not responsive to advanced life saving measures. COL b7c-3, b6-3 stated he did not observe any signs of trauma to the body of Mr ABBAS. COL b7c-3, b6-3 stated Mr ABBAS was pronounced dead at 0032, 8 Feb 04.

AGENT'S COMMENT: A subsequent preliminary examination of the remains of Mr ABBAS, conducted by the aforementioned agents, disclosed no apparent any injuries or trauma.

At 1135, 8 Mar 04, SA [REDACTED] coordinated with COL (DR) b7c-3, b6-3 112th MP Bn, Camp Cropper, BIAP, Baghdad, IZ. COL [REDACTED] was identified as treating and subsequently performing lifesaving measures on Mr ABBAS. COL b7c-3, b6-3 stated he was asleep about 2330, 7 Mar 04, in his quarters, when SGT b7c-4, b6-4 awakened him and told him that one of the detainees was complaining of chest pain. COL b7c-3, b6-3 said he and SGT b7c-4, b6-4 went to the detainee's quarters and found Mr ABBAS lying on his cot rubbing his chest and complaining of a burning pain in his chest. During questioning by SGT b7c-4, b6-4 COL b7c-3, b6-3 heard Mr ABBAS say that he had been experiencing the chest pain for over one-hour before asking for medical assistance. COL b7c-3, b6-3 related that he observed SGT b7c-4, b6-4 question Mr ABBAS concerning his condition and then SGT b7c-4, b6-4 suggested that they move Mr ABBAS to the detainees' medical facility to better diagnose his condition. COL b7c-3, b6-3 stated SGT b7c-4, b6-4 offered to get a stretcher and carry Mr. ABBAS to the detainees' medical facility, but he refused the offer and said he wanted to walk. With SGT b7c-4, b6-4 assistance, they escorted Mr ABBAS to the detainees' medical facility. Once at the medical facility, SGT b7c-4, b6-4 attached a heart monitor to Mr ABBAS' chest. Upon viewing Mr ABBAS heart activity, COL b7c-3, b6-3 said he recognized that Mr ABBAS had recently experienced a heart attack. While he was discussing his observations with SGT b7c-4, b6-4 Mr ABBAS went into cardiac arrest. COL b7c-3, b6-3 stated that he and SGT b7c-4, b6-4 attempted to resuscitate Mr ABBAS by administering epinephrine, lidocaine and utilized the defibrillation machine several times; however, they were unable to revive Mr ABBAS. During this time, several other soldiers administered CPR and rescue breathing. With the arrival of the ambulance from the 477th EMED, COL b7c-3, b6-3 said that he transferred care of

Mr ABBAS to the doctors at that treatment facility. COL [REDACTED] b7C-3, b6-3 said that he had been at Camp Cropper for 10 days, and during that time he had not treated Mr ABBAS. After Mr ABBAS left Camp Cropper, he checked his medical history and discovered that he had suffered two prior heart attacks; one in 1996 and a second in 1999. COL [REDACTED] b7C-3, b6-3 stated that he has been a physician since 1977. COL [REDACTED] b7C-3, b6-3 stated that he has practiced both general medicine and OBGYN.

AGENT'S COMMENT: This agent obtained the medical records pertaining to Mr ABBAS. (See Medical Records pertaining to Mr ABBAS for details)

At 1730, 8 Mar 04, SA ^{b7C-1, b6-1} [REDACTED] and the undersigned interviewed SSG ^{b7C-3, b6-3} [REDACTED] 770th MP Co, Camp Cropper, IZ. SSG ^{b7C-3, b6-3} [REDACTED] stated he was on duty as part of the MP guard force. SSG ^{b7C-4, b6-4} [REDACTED] stated around 2330, 7 Mar 04, he was contacted by SPC ^{b7C-3, b6-3} [REDACTED] who informed him that a detainee was complaining of experiencing chest pains. SSG ^{b7C-3, b6-3} [REDACTED] stated he never had any contact with Mr ABBAS nor was he aware of Mr ABBAS having any existing medical problems. SSG ^{b7C-3, b6-3} [REDACTED] could not provide any further information that would assist in this investigation.

- q. Nine white t-shirts.
- r. One tan Dan Wei Lai fleece sweat suit.
- s. One pair of black shoes.

- w. One upper denture plate.
- x. One blue towel.

A subsequent search of these items did not reveal anything of evidentiary value.

AGENT'S COMMENT: Subsequent coordination with CPT ^{b7c-3, b6-3} [REDACTED] revealed detainees are not allowed to retain their prescribed medication. All medications are maintained in the detainee medical facility and ARE administered by the medical staff.

<p>I, [REDACTED] b7c-4, b6-4 want to make the following statement under oath:</p> <p>I work the 1600 to 2400 hours shift as the S-1 rep for the admin section. I work inside the High Value Detainee area handling routine administrative assignments. On 07 March 2003 at about 2330 hours, SSG [REDACTED] b7c-4, b6-4 came to me and told me to check on detainee #39. The detainee had complained to SSG [REDACTED] b7c-4, b6-4 that he was having chest pains. I went to detainee #39's room, building 4, room D, and found him lying on his cot. He was conscious and moaning, and holding his chest. He looked pale to me. I asked him if his chest hurt and he replied that this chest was "burning." want to make the following statement under oath:

About 2330, 07 March 2004, I saw asleep in my quarters outside the HVD area of Camp Cropper, BIAP when SPC [REDACTED] awakened me. SPC [REDACTED] told me that there was a HVD who was complaining of chest pain. I awakened Dr. (COL) [REDACTED] and told him about the person complaining of chest pain and asked SPC [REDACTED] to get the interpreter, [REDACTED]. The Dr. [REDACTED] and I went over to detainee's room. It turned out to be detainee #39; I don't know the man's name. I examined detainee #39 and noted that he was pale and sweating slightly; he was also pointing to his left breast area. [REDACTED] spoke with him in Arabic and he told [REDACTED] that he had a burning pain in his chest. Detainee #39 also said that the pain had been going on for an hour before he called for assistance. I listened to his heart and it sounded "regular." I took his pulse. I think it was in the low 60's. I told the Dr. [REDACTED] that I thought we needed to take him to our examining area and put him on a cardiac monitor. Dr. [REDACTED] agreed. [REDACTED] explained to the detainee that we want to examine him more closely. The detainee agreed and sat up on his cot. At that point, I helped him walk to our medical area. Once there, we laid him down on the cot and hooked him up to the monitor. Detainee #39 continued to complain about the pain in his chest. I looked at the monitor and it was evident to me that he was having a "ST segment elevation." In layman's terms that means I think he's having a heart attack. That's what I told the doctor and he agreed. Within about 30 seconds detainee #39 went unconscious. At that point, he went into V-TACH. I gave him a pericardial thump to try and restart his heart. It did not work. We started CPR and rescue breathing and gave detainee #39 several types of cardiac medications. None of our treatments seemed to any effect on improving his condition. We continued CPR and rescue breathing until Dr. [REDACTED] obtained a defibrillator from another area of the HVD. We administered defibrillation approximately 5 times, in accordance with standard ACLS protocols (Advanced Cardiac Life Support). These too failed to improve his condition. About this time, the Air Force ambulance arrived. We transferred detainee #39 to the ambulance and the Air Force medics transported to the E-MED facility on BIAP.

Q: Explain your background in emergency medicine.

A: I've been an RN for 13 years. 12 years I've worked in the emergency room. I've been a paramedic for 6 years. I've been an Army medic for 2 months.

Q: Was detainee #39's condition and symptoms consistent with any particular medical condition?

A: Yes, it was consistent with a heart attack. Evidenced by his physical presentation and 5 lead ECG.

Q: Did you see any signs of trauma on detainee #39's person?

A: No.

Q: Have you ever treated detainee #39 before the night of 07 Mar 04?

A: I had no personal medical contacts with him.

Q: Did you know anything about his prior medical history?

A: No. Not until after the incident and I had to the opportunity to review his chart.

I am an Arabic translator employed by Titan Corporation, Baghdad, Iraq and have been for about a year. I work on Camp Cropper, Baghdad International Airport (BIAP), Baghdad, Iraq. I provide translator support to the Military Police for the detainees there. About 1125 PM and I was in my room reading a book. Then someone knocked on my door. I said to come in and it was SPC [REDACTED] SPC [REDACTED] informed me that there was an emergency and he needed my help. I then put on my shoes and we ran out towards the detention compound. When we got to the gate the guards open the doors for us and we went straight to our medical clinic. We then went inside of the clinic and SGT [REDACTED] told me that one of the detainees was complaining of having chest pains. So went to the detainee's room to find out what was going on. When we went inside of the room, there were several detainees there. I went and stood right next to the detainee, and I asked him where does it hurt. And he told me in Arabic, that his chest was kind of tight and he had difficulty breathing in Arabic. He was laying down on his cot and he had a towel on his head. I then turned to the COL [REDACTED] and told him that he was complaining about his chest hurting and he was having difficulty breathing. I told the detainee in Arabic to sit up and get out of the cot so that he could be taken to the clinic. When we got inside of the clinic, I told him to sit on the gurney so that the COL can treat him. I told the detainee to lift up his shirt so that some pads can be put on his chest so that his heart can be monitored. The detainee took his shirt off and started to look pale and extremely tired. Then SGT [REDACTED] put the pads on his chest to start to monitor his heart. I then left and went to the 439th MP Bn trailer and I ran into SPC [REDACTED] I told him to make a phone call because we have a detainee that is complaining of chest pains and he did not look good. I went back to the clinic, and I told the COL and SGT [REDACTED] that emergency help was on the way. At that time the COL was giving mouth to mouth resuscitation to the detainee. I then ran back to the 439th MP Bn trailer, and told SPC [REDACTED] to hurry up because we were losing the man. I then went back to the clinic, and SGT [REDACTED] had an IV hooked up to the patient. He asked me to hold the IV bag up while SGT [REDACTED] gave the detainee a shot and the COL continued to give mouth to mouth to the detainee. The COL then left to get the defibrillator. When he came back, the COL hooked up the machine and gave him a shock. After waiting a minute and watching the monitor, the detainee was unresponsive. So the COL gave him another shock and there was no response from the detainee. They continued to perform CPR on the detainee. Sometime thereafter, the ambulance showed up and we carried the detainee out of the clinic

About 1900 09 Mar 04, SA [REDACTED] interviewed MSG [REDACTED] 447th Emergency Medical Wing, US Air Force (EMEDS), Baghdad, Iraq, APO AE 09342 at the 447th EMED facility on BIAP.

MSG [REDACTED] stated that about 2345 hours, 07 Mar 04, his unit received a telephone call from the 912th Medical Group, US Army, BIAP, APO AE 09342, requesting an ambulance to be dispatched to the High Value Detainee Confinement Center (HVDCC) at Camp Cropper, BIAP. MSG [REDACTED] said that he and two other Air Force medics took an ambulance and immediately drove to the HVDCC. Upon arrival, MSG [REDACTED] stated that he spoke with Dr. (COL) [REDACTED]. Dr. [REDACTED] told him that a detainee had apparently suffered a heart attack and needed additional medical treatment, which his facility could not provide. MSG [REDACTED] stated that he and the other two medics took custody of the detainee as he was placed inside the ambulance. At that time, his two medics relieved the two Army medics who were performing CPR and rescue breathing. The two Air Force medics continued CPR and rescue breath until they reached the 447th EMED facility on BIAP. Once at that location, the emergency room staff began treating the detainee. The emergency room staff continued attempts to resuscitate the detainee for what MSG [REDACTED] estimated was 20 to 25 minutes before the emergency room physician, Dr. [REDACTED] pronounced him dead. MSG [REDACTED] stated that he has never had any previous contact with the detainee, nor did he know who he was.

Agent's Comment: The HVDCC was located approximately 1/4 mile from the EMED facility on BIAP. MSG [REDACTED] stated the other two medics who were with him on the call were SSG [REDACTED] and MSG [REDACTED]. Neither SSG [REDACTED] nor MSG [REDACTED] was available to be interviewed. Both had already left the theatre. Dr. (LTC) [REDACTED] USAF, not Dr. [REDACTED] signed the death certificate; however, both doctors were present in the emergency room when Dr. [REDACTED] pronounced the detainee dead. No additional identifying information could be obtained on the Air Force personnel involved.
