This is an "Operation Iraqi Freedom" Report of Investigation.

This office was notified by the by the Staff Judge Advocate, 4ID, Camp Iron Horse, Tikrit, Iraq, APO AE 09323, Mr RADAD, a detained Iraqi Local National, was shot and killed by SPC [REDACTED] b7C, b6 -1

Investigation established probable cause to believe SPC [REDACTED] b7C, b6 -1 committed the offense of Murder when he failed to follow proper procedure while performing detainee guard duty and fired his M16 rifle at Mr RADAD, killing him.

**BASIS FOR INVESTIGATION:** About 1600, 15 Sep 03, this office was notified by the Staff Judge Advocate, 4ID, Camp Iron Horse, Iraq, that Mr. [REDACTED] a detained Iraqi Local National, was shot and killed at Camp Packhorse, Iraq, by SPC [REDACTED] *b7c, b6*

About 1900, 15 Sep 03, SA [REDACTED] *b7c, b6* obtained a Serious Incident Report (SIR), and a 15-6 investigation packet conducted by MAJ [REDACTED] *b7c, b6* 720<sup>th</sup> Military Police Bn, Camp Iron Horse, Iraq, which disclosed SPC [REDACTED] was in violation of the U.S. Army Use of Force policy and Task Force Iron Horse directives concerning the use of deadly force. (See SIR and 15-6 investigation packet for details) *b7c, b6*

About 23 Oct 03, SA [REDACTED] *b7c, b6* advised SPC [REDACTED] *b7c, b6* of his rights, which he invoked and requested a lawyer.

About 20 Nov 03, SA [REDACTED] *b7c, b6* coordinated with CPT [REDACTED] *b7c, b6* SJA, 4ID, who opined there was probable cause to believe SPC [REDACTED] committed the offense of Murder when he failed to obey SOP and fire his rifle at Mr RADAD, killing him. CPT [REDACTED] *b7c, b6* stated there was already an article 32 hearing where SPC [REDACTED] was being charged for the offense of Voluntary Manslaughter. She stated the results of the hearing concluded that SPC [REDACTED] would not be tried at a courts-martial. ## DETAILS

CRIME SCENE EXAMINATION: Between 1330 and 1400, 20 Sep 03, SA [REDACTED] b7c, b61 conducted a crime scene examination of the Division Central Collection Point (DCCP) located at Camp Packhorse, south of Tikrit, Iraq (grid coordinates 38S LD 79352220).

Characteristics of Scene: The holding facility was a one story, sandstone constructed building. The building was divided in two parts of which one half was on the western end of the building. The other was on the eastern end. Those two parts were divided by a covered breezeway. The cover was an integral part of the main building roof. The western section was one room that occupied that entire end of the building. The eastern end was broken up into five smaller rooms. One was a central hall that connected the other four rooms and the remaining four rooms were positioned such that they lined the exterior walls of the building. The offense occurred in the central hall the eastern most room in the eastern half of the building.

Condition of Scene: Upon entering the sole entrance to the eastern most portion of the building, one stepped into a hallway which was centrally located within that section of the building and ran lengthwise west to east. The room was about twelve feet long and six feet wide. At the approximate center of the north interior wall of that room, sat an air conditioning unit or similar type appliance approximately one foot away from the northern wall. The unit was approximately four feet high, but did not block much of the view of a person looking over it to the back of the room on the eastern end.

To the left (or north) a door led to a small empty room with dimensions of about eight feet by 4.5 feet. Entering that room, one had access to the room directly to the east through a door frame in the eastern wall and flush against the northern exterior wall of the building. The next room was a bathroom with commode, bidet and sink. The dimensions of the bathroom were 6.5 feet by 7.5 feet and no further access to the building could be gained through this room.

From the hallway, once again, one would proceed directly eastbound to the end of the hall where another door frame was located in the eastern most wall which provided access to the back room. The back room ran

lengthwise north to south and had dimensions of approximately 14.5 feet by 6.5 feet. This was the room in which Mr. RADAD was detained when he was shot. No further access could be gained to other parts of the building from this room and no windows existed in the exterior walls of the room. No concertina wire existed separating this room from the central hall as reportedly existed at the time of the offense.

From the hallway, once again, one could proceed southward into a room that extended eastward from the doorway and occupied the majority of the southern exterior wall. That room appeared to be an office of sorts. A work counter was approximately centered on the southern wall and was flush against the wall. A filing cabinet was located in the southwest corner of the room and was flush against the two walls forming that corner with the cabinet facing northward.

Factors Pertinent to Entry/Exit (E/E): Entry to the eastern end of the building could be gained only from one entrance/exit which was located in the approximate center of the breezeway and western wall of the eastern section of the building. There was no door attached to the entrance/exit. The back room where Mr RADAD was shot was similarly missing any door in the door frame.

Environmental Conditions: At the time of the crime scene examination, the outside temperature was about 100 degrees Fahrenheit. The inside temperature was about 90 degrees Fahrenheit with a slight breeze through the building due to the open doors and windows. The sky was clear and sunny. No recent precipitation had been experienced.

Scene Documentation: SA [REDACTED] <sup>b7c, b6, b1</sup> prepared a crime scene sketch and exposed photographs utilizing a Nikon Coolpix995, digital camera documenting all rooms in the eastern end of the building, the breezeway entrance and the entrance to the eastern end of the building.

Collection of Crime Scene Evidence: No such evidence was recovered.

Search for Latent Impressions: A search for latent prints was not conducted as they would not have proven to be of any evidentiary value in the circumstances of this investigation.

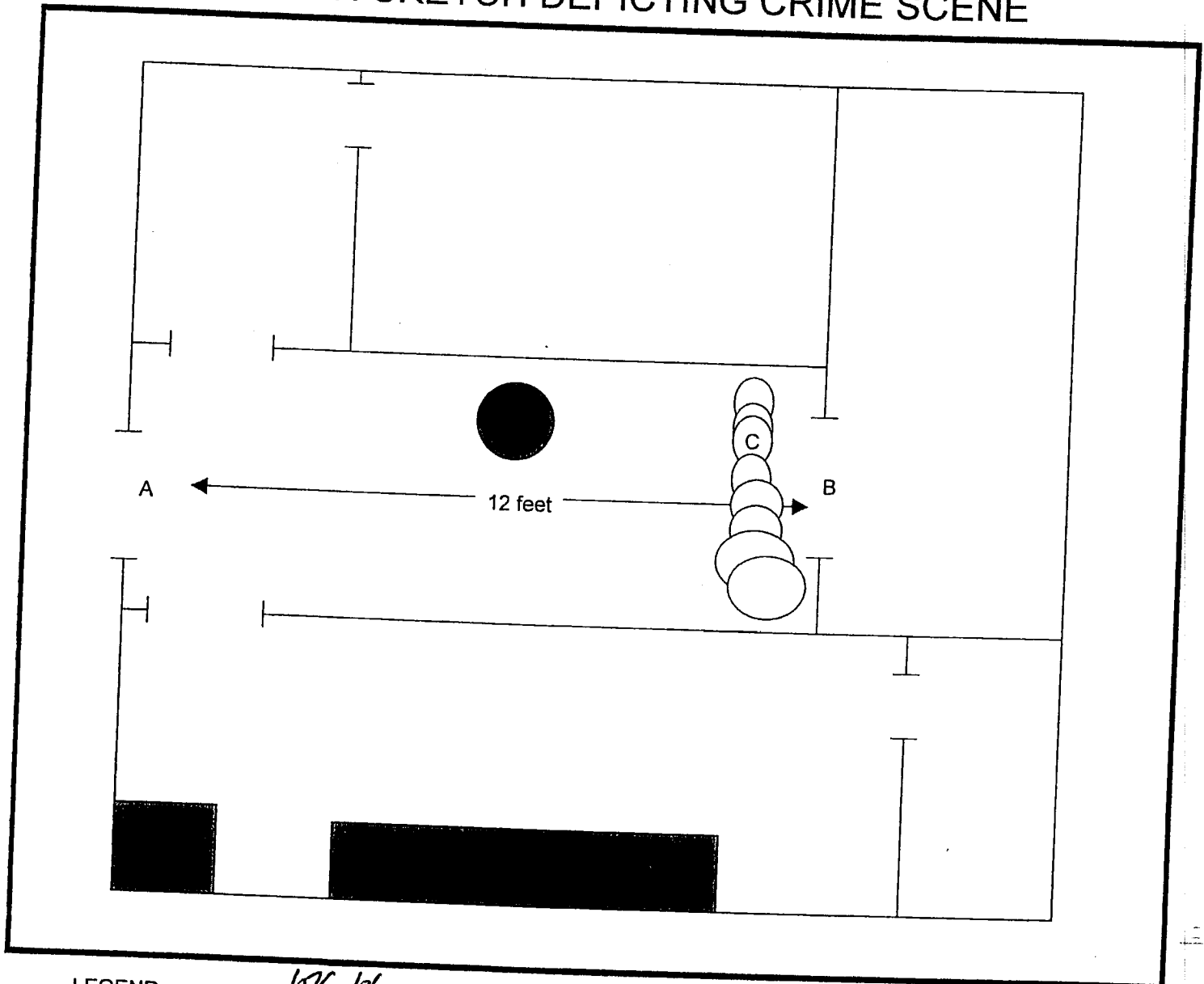

 D= Appliance



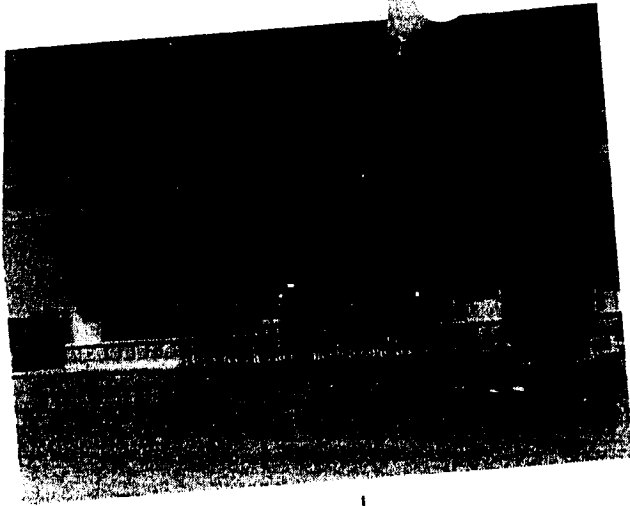

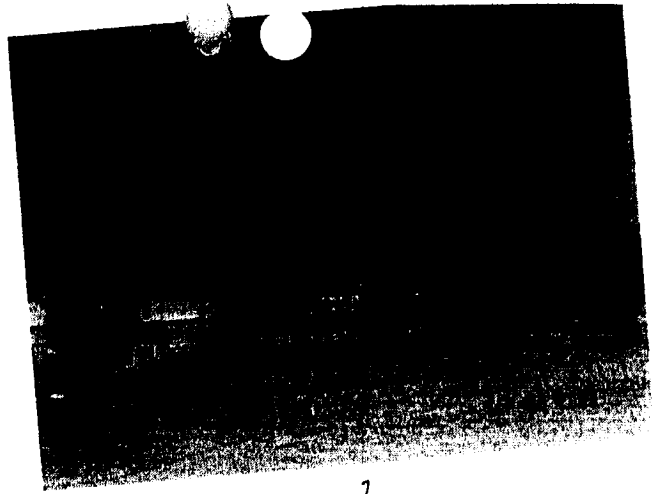

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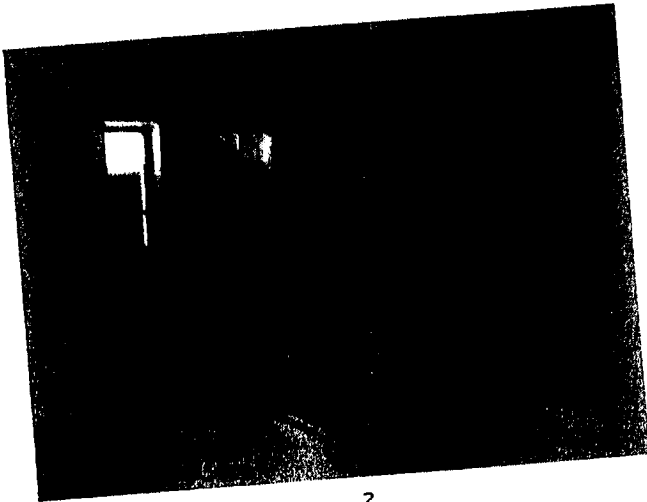

THIS IS AN "OPERATION IRAQI FREEDOM" INVESTIGATION.

PRELIMINARY INVESTIGATION DISCLOSED SHORTLY AFTER SPC [REDACTED] WAS PLACED ON DUTY AT THE ENEMY PRISONER OF WAR (EPW) FACILITY, HE HAD BEEN OBSERVED BY GUARDS AND EPWS ALIKE, EXHIBITING BELLIGERENT AND AGGRESSIVE BEHAVIOR TOWARD RADAD AND HAD ENGAGED IN A YELLING SPREE WITH RADAD THE NIGHT BEFORE THE INCIDENT. SPC [REDACTED] HAD ONLY BEEN DETAILED TO GUARD DUTY AT THE FACILITY FOR THREE DAYS AND WAS BRIEFED ON THE USE OF DEADLY FORCE WHICH CONSISTED OF SHOOTING EPWS IF THEY APPROACHED THE WIRE WITHOUT

PERMISSION, AND ONLY AFTER VERBAL WARNINGS AND OTHER MEASURES WERE FIRST CONSIDERED BEFORE APPLYING LETHAL FORCE. ON 8 SEP 03, RADAD, WHO WAS DETAINED IN A RAID IN AD DWAR ON 31 AUG 03, WAS PLACED IN AN ISOLATION CELL WITH HIS HANDS FLEXI-CUFFED IN FRONT OF HIM AND HELD FOR QUESTIONING FOR POSSIBLE TIES TO MRS [REDACTED] (WIFE OF [REDACTED]) b7c, b6

UPON HIS ARRIVAL, MR RADAD WAS INSTRUCTED TO REMAIN SEATED AND TO STAY AWAY FROM THE CONCERTINA WIRE, OR HE WOULD BE SHOT.

SPC [REDACTED] WHO WAS THE ON-DUTY GUARD FOR THE ISOLATION CELL, REPORTED DURING THE INITIAL INQUIRY THAT DURING HIS DETAINMENT, MR RADAD WAS "FIDDLING" WITH HIS FLEX-CUFFS AND ATTEMPTING TO SPEAK WITH ANOTHER DETAINEE IN AN ADJACENT HOLDING CELL. AT THE TIME OF THE INCIDENT, SPC [REDACTED] REPORTED HE HAD MOMENTARILY TURNED AWAY FROM MR RADAD AND WHEN HE TURNED BACK TO THE ISOLATION CELL, HE SAW THAT MR RADAD HAD SAT UP AND WAS LEANING OVER THE STRAND OF CONCERTINA WIRE. SPC [REDACTED] WHO STATED HE THOUGHT MR RADAD WAS ATTEMPTING TO ESCAPE, LOWERED HIS M-16 RIFLE AND SHOT MR RADAD. THE ROUND WENT THROUGH MR RADAD'S FLEXI-CUFFED ARM AND INTO HIS ABDOMEN. b7c b65

SPC [REDACTED] DID NOT FOLLOW PROPER PROCEDURE WHEN HE FIRED HIS M16 AT MR RADAD, DELIBERATELY SHOOTING AND KILLING HIM. PRIOR TO THE SHOOTING, SPC [REDACTED] USED NO b7c b65

VERBAL WARNING NOR DID HE FOLLOW INSTRUCTIONS FOR THE GRADUATED USE OF FORCE AS RELATED IN 4ID FRAGO 422, 16 MAY 03, WHICH PROVIDES GUIDANCE FOR THE USE OF GRADUATED FORCE AND SPECIFICALLY IDENTIFIES A "SHOUT, SHOW, SHOVE, SHOOT, SHOOT" METHODOLOGY, BUT AIMED HIS WEAPON WITH THE INTENT TO KILL MR RADAD BASED ON MR RADAD'S ACTIONS.

MR RADAD WAS TRANSPORTED TO E COMPANY, 4TH FORWARD SUPPORT BN MEDICAL AID STATION WHERE MEDICAL AID WAS GIVEN. MR RADAD DIED FROM HIS WOUNDS AND WAS PRONOUNCED DEAD BY UNKNOWN MEDICAL PERSONNEL AT APPROXIMATELY 2330, 11 SEP 03.

1. References:

2. The investigations concerning the abuse of detained persons by U.S. military and civilian contracted personnel and the deaths of detained persons while in U.S. custody have generated significant Department of Defense, Congressional, and international attention. Several Congressional and Department of Defense task forces and commissions have been created to review divergent aspects of detainee operations as well as investigations conducted by the USACIDC. It is expected this scrutiny and oversight will continue for the foreseeable future.

3. Upon closure of any CID Action (non-Report of Investigation (ROI)), any Unfounded CID ROI, or any CID ROI with an Unknown Subject pertaining to allegations of the abuse of detained persons by U.S. military and contracted personnel or the death of a detained person, the original case file, including any Agent's Notes, will be forwarded to Director, U.S. Army Crime Records Center, ATTN: CICR-CR, 6010 6<sup>th</sup> Street, Fort Belvoir, VA 22060-5506, where it will be retained. A copy of the case file should be retained by the CID element IAW the above references.

4. Upon the transmittal of the Final ROI of any CID ROI with a Known Subject pertaining to allegations of the abuse of detained persons by U.S. Military and contracted personnel or the death of a detained person, a copy of the case file, including any Agent's Notes, will be forwarded to Director, U.S. Army Crime Records Center, ATTN: CICR-CR, 6010 6<sup>th</sup> Street, Fort Belvoir, VA 22060-5506. The original of the case file will be retained by the CID element until the closure of the ROI. Once the ROI is closed (completion of adjudication of all subjects in CID ROIs and receipt of all Commander's Report of Disciplinary or Administrative Action Taken (DA Form 4833)), the original case file, including any Agent's Notes, will be forwarded to Director, U.S. Army Crime Records Center, ATTN: CICR-CR, 6010 6<sup>th</sup> Street, Fort Belvoir, VA

"Abuse" includes, but is not limited to, punitive articles of the Uniform Code of Military Justice and/or similar provisions of Title 18, US Code.

SUBJECT: Operational Review of 0149-03-CID469-60209

1. On 17 May 04, this office received a Request for Investigation (0212-04-CID001) from Headquarters, USACIDC, via 3<sup>rd</sup> Military Police Group (CID), Forest Park, GA, to conduct an operational review of all detainee deaths and other crimes against detainees by U.S. Military personnel during Operation Iraqi Freedom (OIF) and Operation Enduring Freedom (OEF).
2. On 17 and 18 May 04, the undersigned conducted an operational review of the above referenced Report of Investigation to determine if it was operationally sufficient. This ROI was initiated on 15 Sep 03. When the 43<sup>rd</sup> MP Detachment (CID), Ft Hood, TX was re-deployed from Tikrit, Iraq, they brought the case file back for distribution to Crime Records Center (CRC), Ft Belvoir, VA. The case file is maintained at the Ft Hood RA in accordance with applicable regulations.
3. This investigation was initiated upon notification that detainee Mr. Obeed Hethere RADAD was shot and killed by SPC [REDACTED]. On 23 Nov 03, the investigation was closed as a final(C) under the provisions on CIDR 195-1, chapt 4-17(6) (SAC prerogative). However, on 20 Nov 03, coordination with SJA revealed on 12 Nov 03, SPC [REDACTED] was reduced to E1 and received a Chapt 10 discharge in lieu of court martial. The following information was extracted during the review:
  - a. CID was notified of the incident after a 15-6 determined SPC [REDACTED] did not follow regulations governing the use of deadly force. The notification occurred 4 days after the fact.

b. Three witness statements and SPC [REDACTED] confession during the 15-6 (without rights advisement) substantiated the CID investigation and 15-6. SPC [REDACTED] requested a lawyer when advised of his rights by the unit and CID.

c. The delay in reporting prevented the recovery of forensic evidence, specifically:

1. the projectile was not recovered from the deceased nor the scene (although agents did conduct a CS exam upon notification)
2. no autopsy was conducted of the remains
3. the M16 rifle was not collected as evidence.

4. Subsequent to the case review, I discussed with the former SAC why the rifle was not collected as evidence. The former SAC responded that the rifle was not collected because there was no projectile to compare it to. I explained fingerprint evidence could have been a key to the investigation since the subject confessed without rights advisement, which would have meant, if this had gone to court martial, the confession would have been thrown out. Further the witness testimony could have been under question by a good defense attorney. Fingerprint evidence would have supported the events under investigation (and possibly *only* his fingerprints on the weapon verses the defense tactic "it wasn't my client and someone else"). The former SAC rebutted by saying the subject's prints would have been on the weapon anyway, since it was his assigned weapon.

5. The issues addressed in paragraph 4 above will be addressed in training during the upcoming staff (site) assistance visits.

6. Although not completely thorough (i.e. collection of the weapon for fingerprint analysis) this ROI will be NOT be reopened as further investigation would not change the outcome of the investigation. The subject received non-judicial punishment for the offense and is no longer in the military.

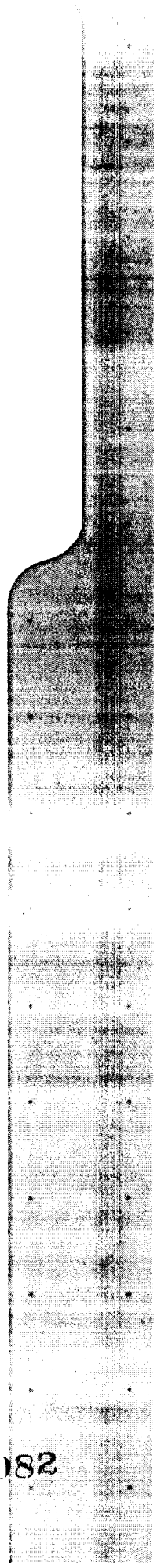
