INVESTIGATIVE SUMMARY:

This is an "Operation Iraqi Freedom" investigation. The delay in dispatching this report was due to the lack of secure communications capabilities for CID at Camp Bucca, Um Qasr, Iraq.

This investigation was initiated based on information received from COL [REDACTED] b7C-3, b6-3 Commander, Camp Bucca, Iraq who notified this office of a possible fatal shooting of a civilian by a tower guard at the Camp Bucca Internment Facility, Iraq. COL [REDACTED] reported on 12 May 03, there was an incident b7C-3, b6-3 where a tower guard observed an unidentified individual attempting to cross the south berm of the compound. A warning shot was fired and the individual was apprehended and appeared to have had an abrasion on his face. He was taken to the Battalion Aide Station for medical treatment where it was subsequently determined he suffered a gun shot wound to the face and was subsequently evacuated to an unknown location. COL [REDACTED] explained he had heard information that suggested the individual had b7C-3, b6-3 succumbed to his wounds and was deceased at the Medical Facility where he was treated.

Investigation established probable cause to believe PFC [REDACTED] b7C-5, b6-5 committed the offenses of Failure to Obey Order or Regulation and Reckless Endangerment when he, while acting in his capacity as a Camp Bucca Perimeter Guard, failed to follow the prescribed Rules Of Engagement (ROE) orders detailing the use of warning shots to deter individuals from entering or exiting the camp. PFC [REDACTED] b7C-5, b6-5 observed Mr. [REDACTED] b7C-4, b6-4 approaching the outer perimeter of Camp Bucca and instructed him to halt, (both in Arabic and English) when he failed to stop, PFC [REDACTED] b7C-5, b6-5 fired a warning shot, utilizing a 12 Gauge Shotgun. The warning shot was fired in the direction of Mr. [REDACTED] b7C-4, b6-4 feet instead of in a safe direction as ordered by the ROE and Camp Bucca Force Protection Order. Mr. [REDACTED] b7C-4, b6-4 was struck in the face by one projectile and was treated for his injuries at a U.S. Army Medical Facility and then turned over to an Iraqi Civilian Hospital in Baghdad, Iraq. Mr. [REDACTED] b7C-4, b6-4 was expected to make a full recovery from his injuries. b7C-4, b6-4

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DETAILS

Basis for Investigation: About 1100Z, 14 May 03, COL ^{b7c-3, b6-3} [REDACTED], Commander, Camp Bucca, Iraq notified this office of a possible fatal shooting of a civilian by a tower guard at the Camp Bucca Internment Facility, Iraq. COL [REDACTED] reported on 12 May 03, there was an incident where a tower guard observed an unidentified individual attempting to cross the south berm of the compound. A warning shot was fired and the individual was apprehended and appeared to have had an abrasion on his face. He was taken to the Camp Medical Center where it was subsequently determined he suffered a gun shot wound to the face and was subsequently evacuated to an unknown location. COL [REDACTED] explained he had heard information that suggested the individual had succumbed to his wound and passed away at the Medical Facility where he was treated. No further information as available at the time.

About 1200Z, 14 May 03, SA ^{b7c-1, b6-1} [REDACTED] received and reviewed the Accident/Serious Incident Report (SIR) generated by the 822nd MP Company detailing the shooting. The SIR reported the guard in Watch Tower 73 fired a warning shot at an unidentified civilian male when he failed to respond to an order to stop in both Arabic and English. The warning shot was allegedly one round of 00 Buck Shot fired from a 12 Gauge Shot Gun. There was no mention of the victim being struck by the round and the report indicated the victim was taken into custody without incident. (See SIR for additional details)

About 1210Z, 14 May 03, SA ^{b7c-1, b6-1} [REDACTED] coordinated with CPT ^{b7c-4, b6-4} [REDACTED], Camp Bucca Medical Facility, Camp Bucca, Iraq who initially treated the civilian victim when he was brought into the Medical Facility. CPT [REDACTED] explained the victim was brought to the tent with what appeared to be a laceration on his upper left cheek. After examining an X-Ray, it was determined there was a projectile consistent with the shape and size of a 9MM round lodged in his neck. CPT [REDACTED] treated the wound and arranged to have the victim Medically Evacuated to Camp Viper, which is the nearest Field Surgical Hospital. About 00500Z, 12 May 03, the victim was transported by a U.S. Army Helicopter destined for Camp Viper. CPT [REDACTED] was unsure of the victim's current status or whereabouts. CPT [REDACTED] was not able to provide this office with any identification on the victim as the medical records had been transported with the victim.

SHOOTING CRIME SCENE EXAMINATION: About 0600Z, 15 May 03, SA ^{b7c-1, b6-1} [REDACTED] traveled to the Camp Bucca Internment Facility, Camp Bucca, Iraq to conduct a shooting scene examination of the area where the alleged fatal shooting took place:

Characteristics of Scene: The shooting scene was located in the southeast corner of the Camp Bucca Internment Facility (QU7839227814) and was identified as Guard Tower 73. The guard tower was a metal and wood tower, approximately 12 feet high (to the standing platform) by 12 feet deep by 7 feet wide. The tower was located approximately ten feet south of the inner perimeter (triple strand concertina wire) and about 62 feet north of the outer perimeter (berm). There was a 21 feet wide gravel road located 41 feet south of the tower, running east/west between the guard towers and the outer berm. Immediately north of Guard Tower 73 was the Internment Facility. To the south of the berm was open desert with approximately 15 miles of open visibility. The berm itself was constructed of loose sand and was approximately 10 feet tall and encircled the entire Internment Facility. The distance from the southwest corner of the guard tower where the shot was fired from to the top of the berm where the victim was standing was approximately 81 feet. The elevation of the tower and the berm placed both the shooter and the victim at generally the same height.

Condition of Scene: The shooting scene itself was unremarkable as several days had past since the incident and the area was generally sterile. There were no signs of the shooting or even footprints remaining in the sand where the victim had approached the berm, as over the last several days, there had been strong winds and the sand had covered the entire area. There were no indications anyone had been walking outside the berm.

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DETAILS

Factors Pertinent to Entry/Exit: Access to the shooting scene could be gained on foot or by vehicle from the south, east and west and access would be totally unobstructed. The area around the internment facility is open desert and not restricted in anyway.

Environmental Condition: At the time of the shooting, it was approximately 80 degrees and sunny with a slight wind. Visibility was approximately four or five miles.

Scene Documentation: SA ^{b7c-1, b6-1} exposed several photographs of the guard tower, location of the victim and the area around the shooting scene utilizing a digital camera. SA ^{b7c-1, b6-1} also prepared a sketch of the scene depicting the guard tower and location of the victim and the measurement between both.

Collection of Evidence: No evidence was collected at the scene.

Search for Latent Prints: A search for latent prints was not conducted as it was not applicable to the current investigation. A search for foot impression was conducted around the location where the victim was seen crossing the berm but due to the consistency of the sand the weather over the previous several days, not foot impression were discovered.

Search Beyond the Scene: A search beyond the scene was conducted for any additional information or evidence pertaining the shooting. Nothing remarkable was discovered during the search. The search was limited to the area close to the perimeter berm as there are believed to be land mines outside the berm.

About 0650Z, 15 May 03, SA ^{b7c-1, b6-1} coordinated with and interviewed LTC ^{b7c-3, b6-3} Commander, 724th MP Battalion, Camp Bucca, Iraq. SA ^{b7c-1, b6-1} advised LTC ^{b7c-3, b6-3} that CID was assuming investigative responsibility of this incident due to a request by COL ^{b7c-1, b6-1} LTC ^{b7c-3, b6-3} explained she did not have any direct information pertaining to the incident but would make her personnel available for interviews as soon as possible.

About 0700Z, 15 May 03, SA ^{b7c-1, b6-1} interviewed SPC ^{b7c-4, b6-4} 822nd MP Company, Camp Bucca, Iraq who was assigned to the guard tower immediately west of the incident location. SPC ^{b7c-4, b6-4} was also the individual who subsequently apprehended the victim. SPC ^{b7c-4, b6-4} reported on the morning of 12 May 03, approximately 0800 local (0500Z) he heard what he believed to be a gunshot coming from the Tower to the east of his position (Tower 73). Due to the location of the generator and the noise it was making, he was not immediately sure he heard a gun shot. When SPC ^{b7c-4, b6-4} turned around, he observed an individual running outside the berm towards his position. He immediately drew his side arm and commanded the individual to halt. The individual came over the berm and stopped just below SPC ^{b7c-4, b6-4} guard tower and sat on the ground. At the same time, two roving patrols arrived on the scene and took the individual into custody. SPC ^{b7c-4, b6-4} reported seeing blood coming from the individuals face and mouth but he did not appear to be seriously injured. The roving patrols were then ordered to take the victim to the Medical Facility for treatment. When asked if he witnessed any weapons in the victim's possession, SPC ^{b7c-4, b6-4} stated he believed the individual was carrying a stick approximately two feet in length. SPC ^{b7c-4, b6-4} was not able to provide any addition information pertaining to the incident on 12 May 03.

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DETAILS

About 0800Z, 15 May 03, SA ^{b7c-1, b6-1} interviewed SSG ^{b7c-4, b6-4} and SGT ^{b7c-4, b6-4} both from 822nd MP Company, Camp Bucca, Iraq who were both traveling together as the roving patrol around the Internment Facility on 12 May 03. SSG ^{b7c-4, b6-4} and SGT ^{b7c-4, b6-4} both explained about 0500Z, 12 May 03, they responded to a radio call of a shooting on the south perimeter. Upon their arrival at SPC ^{b7c-4, b6-4} position, they observed an unidentified civilian sitting on the ground bleeding from the face and mouth. They immediately took the individual into custody without incident and brought him to the Camp Bucca Medical Facility for treatment of his wounds.

About 0900Z, 15 May 03, SA ^{b7c-1, b6-1} received and reviewed a hand written statement prepared by PFC ^{b7c-5, b6-5} ^{b7c-1, b6-1} 822nd MP Company, Camp Bucca, Iraq immediately following the incident. PFC ^{b7c-1, b6-1} was the guard on duty at Tower 73 and was the soldier who fired the warning shot. The statement detailed the incident on 12 May 03 as described by PFC ^{b7c-1, b6-1}. In the statement, PFC ^{b7c-1, b6-1} reports seeing an individual approaching the outer berm of the Internment Facility and he immediately called out halt in both Arabic and English, when the individual refused to stop, he fired one warning short with a 12 gauge shotgun, loaded with lethal ammunition, at the feet of the individual. The statement further explains, after the warning shot, the individual turned and ran back outside the berm, and headed west until he reached the next Guard Tower where he re-crossed the berm and surrendered to the guard at the tower. (See hand written statement of PFC ^{b7c-1, b6-1} for details)

About 1000Z, 15 May 03, SA ^{b7c-1, b6-1} departed Camp Bucca, Iraq traveling to the Camp Viper Medical Facility, Iraq to locate and determine the status of the individual who was allegedly shot at and wounded by PFC ^{b7c-1, b6-1}. Upon arrival at Camp Viper, SA ^{b7c-1, b6-1} was able to identify the victim as Mr. ^{b7c-1, b6-1}. No further identification was available as all medical records had been forwarded to the Baghdad Training Hospital, Baghdad, Iraq.

About 1200Z, 15 May 03, SA ^{b7c-1, b6-1} interviewed CAPT (O-6) ^{b7c-3, b6-3} Director of Medical Services, U.S. Navy Surgical Hospital, Camp Viper, Iraq who was the commander of the field hospital. CAPT ^{b7c-3, b6-3} explained on 12 May 03, Mr. ^{b7c-1, b6-1} was brought into the hospital with a single gunshot wound to the right cheek. Upon further examination and examination of the X-Rays, it was determined a projectile was lodged in his neck resting against an artery. CAPT ^{b7c-3, b6-3} explained the projectile could not be removed without causing further injury so it was left in place. CAPT ^{b7c-3, b6-3} explained, with proper medical care, Mr. ^{b7c-1, b6-1} was expected to make a full recovery. CAPT ^{b7c-3, b6-3} also reported Mr. ^{b7c-1, b6-1} and all of his medical records and X-Rays were forwarded to the civilian medical personnel at the Baghdad Hospital and unfortunately, there were no records available. CAPT ^{b7c-3, b6-3} did state the projectile lodged in Mr. ^{b7c-1, b6-1} neck was not consistent with a shot from a 12 Gauge Shotgun and based on his experience and the observations of his staff, the projectile lodged in the victims neck was consistent with the shape and size of a 9mm round. CAPT ^{b7c-3, b6-3} reported seeing three to four gunshot wounds a day come through the Field Hospital and he was certain of the size and shape of the projectile. CAPT ^{b7c-3, b6-3} was not able to provide any additional information pertaining to this investigation, and when questioned about how Camp Bucca could have been incorrectly notified that Mr. ^{b7c-1, b6-1} had passed away, he explained the communication from the hospital are sometimes relayed though two or three people before they reach there destination and mix ups happen. CAPT ^{b7c-3, b6-3} assured SA ^{b7c-1, b6-1} that when Mr. ^{b7c-1, b6-1} departed his hospital on 14 May 03, he was alive and well.

About 0812Z, 16 May 03, SA ^{b7c-1, b6-1} advised PFC ^{b7c-3, b6-3} of his legal rights for the offenses of Reckless Endangerment and Failure to Obey Order or Regulation which he invoked and requested legal counsel. The interview was subsequently terminated and PFC ^{b7c-3, b6-3} was released back to his unit.

About 0650Z, 16 May 03, SA ^{b7C-1, b6-1} received and reviewed the Rules of Engagement for the Camp Bucca Internee Facility. About 1200Z, 18 May 03, SA ^{b7C-1, b6-1} received and reviewed the sworn statements of MAJ ^{b7C-4, b6-4} and CPT ^{b7C-4, b6-4} both from 724th MP Bn, Camp Bucca, Iraq which detailed there actions when requested to obtain SPC ^{b7C-4, b6-4} issued weapons and conduct a round count of his 9MM ammunition. (See Statements for details)

About 1230Z, 18 May 03, SA ^{b7C-1, b6-1} received and reviewed the statement of SPC ^{b7C-4, b6-4} ^{b7C-4, b6-4} Unit Armorer, 724th MP Bn, Camp Bucca, Iraq which detailed the Functions check conducted on all three of PFC ^{b7C-4, b6-4} issued weapons. SPC ^{b7C-4, b6-4} reported all three weapons (M-9, M-16 and 12 Gauge Shot Gun) were functional and able to be fired.

About 1100Z, 19 May 03, SA ^{b7C-1, b6-1} and CPT ^{b7C-3, b6-3} (Firearms Instructor) conducted a test fire of PFC ^{b7C-3, b6-3} 12 Gauge Shot Gun utilizing a cardboard target to determine the actual spread of the 00 Buck Pellets at 81 feet to verify the validity of PFC ^{b7C-3, b6-3} statement. The test, which was conducted by firing three shots from PFC ^{b7C-3, b6-3} position at a target located in the position the victim was standing, determined the average pattern (spread) of the 9 pellets was 24.2 inches high by 16.2 inches wide. Based on the test fires, it is the opinion of CPT ^{b7C-3, b6-3} that the warning shot would have had to be aimed somewhere between the chest and 12 to 14 inches above the head for a round to have struck the victim. Therefore, PFC ^{b7C-3, b6-3} accounts of the incident could not be accurate.

About 1300Z, 19 May 03, SA ^{b7C-1, b6-1} briefed MAJ ^{b7C-3, b6-3} 3rd MP Group, Legal Counsel, Camp Bucca, Iraq on the details of this investigation. MAJ ^{b7C-3, b6-3} opined there was probable cause to believe PFC ^{b7C-3, b6-3} committed the offenses of Reckless Endangerment and Failure to Obey Order or Regulation when he disregarded the Camp Bucca Force Protection Rules of Engagement and fired a warning shot in the direction of an approaching civilian which stuck the civilian causing injury.///LAST ENTRY///

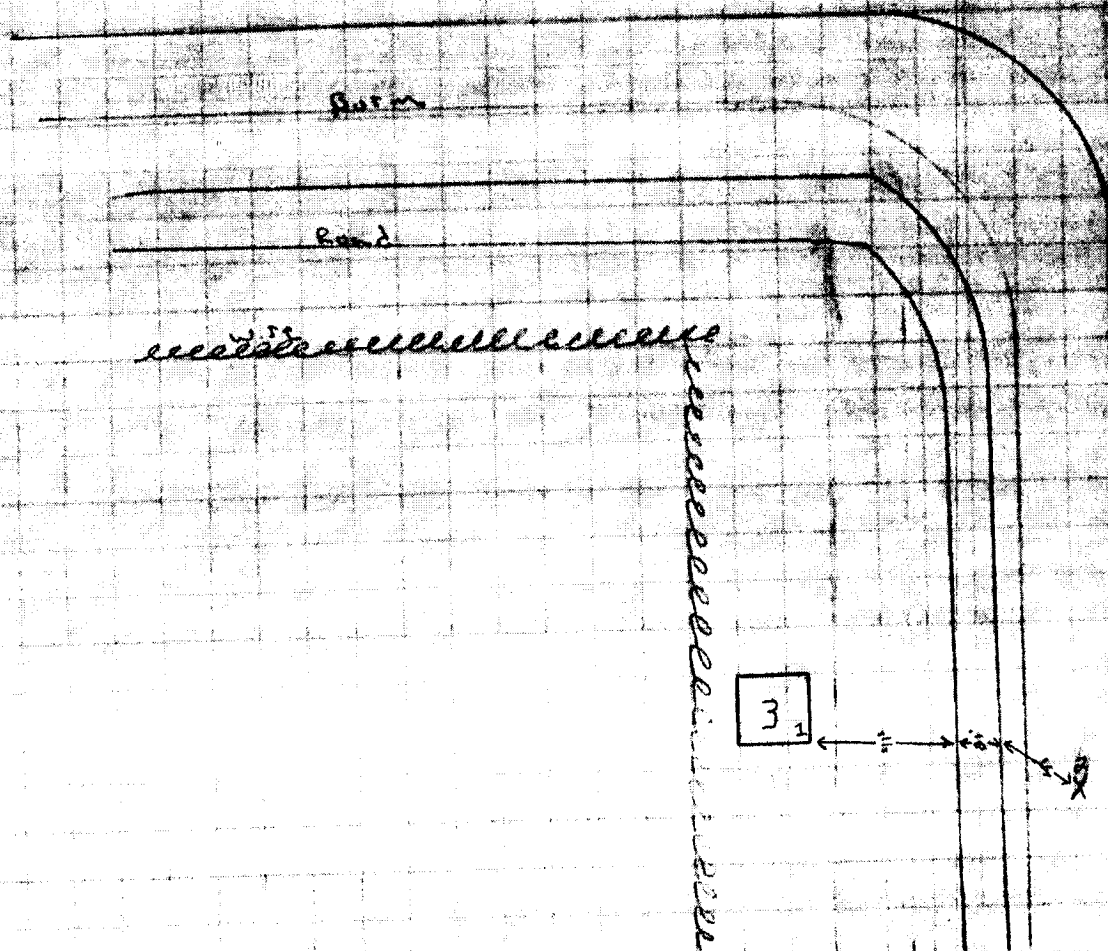

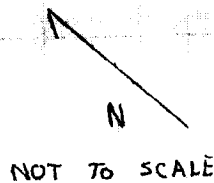

Upon arrival At tower, PFC ^{b7c-5, b6-5} [redacted] stated he had shot At A prisoner near his tower. He then stated the prisoner was NEAR the tower to the west of his. We went to the next tower to see where he was At. As we got nearer we saw Spc ^{b7c-4, b6-4} [redacted] in his tower pointing his weapon at A prisoner on the ground. We jumped out and secured the prisoner. We noticed that he was bleeding on his Cheek. We called TMC + brought the prisoner to the medics. The medics treated the prisoner As best they could. We were then told by the Cpt. of the medics to take him to the Spanish Hospital in the FRT of the Camp. We took him there + Left him with the Spanish.
