(S) The subject of the investigation was SABAH AL-KHAYT, an Iraqi MiG pilot who defected to the Soviet Union during flight training in 1969. AL-KHAYT married a Russian woman who was working for Soviet intelligence. AL-KHAYT and his wife later emigrated to Beirut, Lebanon and later to West Germany.
