I spoke with [REDACTED] at DoD today about the advice-of-rights issue at GITMO. He began by saying there would not be any fundamental change in the position we have agreed to re: Miranda warnings (i.e., no warnings). He did say, however, that "some within DoD" have recommended a truncated advisement that the detainee did not have to talk to the investigators if he didn't want to. Obviously this was a veiled reference to the joint JAG memo to the DoD-GC. [REDACTED] did not seem too enamored of the idea himself, but made it clear that it was still under discussion. DoD lawyers are concerned about the
