I returned [REDACTED] call. He is fine on our proposal of giving them access to the documents and then giving copies of only those documents they actually want.

He seems most concerned that, in his view, "things keep coming out." I explained to him (as I have previously to others at DoD) that the documents we gave them in January cover what FBI management knows of arguable mistreatment of detainees by DoD employees or contractors. While there may be other random documents that were not in that submission (and that ACLU may make hay with), they are duplicative of what DoD already has (in the sense of referring to the same incidents). I also told him that there is no way we can say nothing else will come out inasmuch as our own IG is conducting an investigation that may turn over something that we are unaware of.
