B. Friendly Assets.

1. Mission of Next Higher Unit:

a: DoD Intelligence Exploitation Base - South (IEB-S). On order of the USCENTCOM J2X₂ the 513th Military Intelligence Brigade, 202nd Military Intelligence Battalion, Defense Intelligence Agency (DIA), and other DoD units and assets with Defense Humint Services (DHS) augmentation, will deploy to the ITO to establish the IEB-S in southern Iraq. The J2X will manage, coordinate, and deconflict Counterintelligence (CI) and Human Intelligence (HUMINT) collection operations in support of the Combatant Commander's Priority Intelligence Requirements (PIR) and other identified requirements throughout the ITO. The J2X provides intelligence support to USCENTCOM and its subordinate commands through the management, coordination and deconfliction of national and service CI/HUMINT assets, to include exploitation of enemy prisoners of war (EPWs), displaced persons (DPs), captured documents and equipment from sensitive sites. Exploitation of documents and equipment will occur primarily in the Joint Document Exploitation Center (IDEC) and Joint Media Exploitation Center (IMEC).

Composition of IEB-S, when fully manned, will be approximately 350 personnel. Of this number, a significant amount will be dedicated to force protection and logistical support of the U.S. military and personnel from other government agencies (OGA's) involved in exploitation efforts:

b. FBIHQ-Counterterrorism Division (CTD). Will designate points of contact (POCs), both Supervisory Special Agents (SSAs) and Intelligence Operations. Specialists (IOSs), to whom deployed FBI personnel will transmit intelligence collected by other agencies and investigation conducted in ITO. CTD will assist supporting units (including CIRG, RDLU, HMRU, CRU) in obtaining necessary funding to support the mission. CTD will also provide administrative support for FBI personnel deployed within the ITO.

c. FBI Liaison (LNO) to Joint Forces Special Operations Component Command (JFSOCC) and to Five FBI personnel. will from the Iraqi Operations Group (IOG) on a secure U.S. military compound. The duties of the FBI

LNO will be to serve as the FBI command and control (C2) entity and to coordinate with the major staff components of JFSOCC and ______ Additionally, the LNO will act as a conduit for information between FBIHQ - SIOC, DoD, OGA, and deployed FBI personnel throughout the ITO. All information directed into or out of the ITO will flow through the LNO. The LNO will also facilitate requests for information (RFIs) originating from JFSOCC, CENTCOM, and to the FBI.

d. FBI Mutla, Document Seizure Team (DST). A team of seven, consisting of six CIRG personnel (1 SSA/5 SAs) and one SA Arab linguist, will forward deploy to co-locate with _______ and DoD Special Operations Forces (SOF) at a forward operating base₃(FOB) in Mutla, Kuwait. The DST will be responsible for the collection of intelligence materials from IISHQ as stated above in Section I.

e FBI Mutla/DOCEX. Ten FBI personnel with expertise in document exploitation (DOCEX) and long-range communications will be located in Kuwait. They will perform rapid triage and processing of the intelligence information seized from IISHQ by the FBI DST element for rapid electronic transmission to FBIHQ for analysis and dissemination.

f. FBI Hydra/DOCEX. A team of four, consisting of two DOCEX (one agent and one IOS), one Electronics Technicians (ET) and one Technically Trained Agent (TTA) SSA from the Crisis Response Unit (CRÚ), will establish and maintain a T-1 communications link with FBIHQ. This link will be used by DOCEX personnel for transmission of intelligence in the event that seized documents are initially examined at Hydra Base, Jordan.

g. Intelligence Exploitation Base - South (IEB-S). IEB-S will be staffed following the completion of the Mutla DOCEX mission. Eight DOCEX personnel from the Mutla operation will transfer to IEB-S. This team will support and assist the military and OGA forces at IEB-S with the processing of collected materials. Items meeting the criteria of the FBI's triage list will be processed as evidence and electronic versions will be transmitted to LNO via CRU's secure T-1 communications link for dissemination to FBIHQ. With specific FBIHQ approval, these team members will move forward with the IEB-S into southern Iraq approximately sixty days after the initiation of operations.

h. Joint Interrogation Facility-North (JIF-N). The military has offered to provide between three and five billets for FBI personnel within JIF-N, which will initially stand up in southeastern Turkey. The FBI will deploy a minimum-sized team of three agents (one DOCEX team leader; one CART SA; one CRU SA.) to further assess viability in the JIF-N. This team will support and assist military and OGA forces at JIF-N

Concept of the Operation. The FBI will deploy several elements to FOBs to accomplish the mission, among them the Mutla DST and DOCEX teams, which will co-locate wit and DoD SOF personnel at FOB Mutla, Kuwait. The Hydra DOCEX team (Jordan) will deploy to and operate from FOB Hydra Base. C2 will be provided by the LNO element in Qatar. Designated personnel from Mutla DOCEX will transition to duties in the IEB-S once DOCEX support is no longer needed to support the DST. The Mutla DOCEX element will and be in position to conduct triage, scanning, and processing coordinate with of seized documents and electronic media captured by the DST. The seized information will be relayed by Mutla DOCEX to FBIHQ via a T-1 secure communications link. Hydra DOCEX will have a T-1 secure communications link established with FBIHQ for transmission of data in the event that seized documents are transported to Hydra Base instead of Mutla Base. FBI personnel from DOCEX and CRU will be co-located with personnel in Hydra Base and are responsible for establishing and maintaining a T-1 link with FBIHQ. If it becomes apparent that seized documents will be transported to Hydra Base instead of Mutla Base the DOCEX team from FOB Mutla will be transported to Hydra Base between Kuwait and Jordan.

The FBI personnel will be in the ITO to support Sensitive Site Exploitations (SSEs) once U.S. ground combat forces have moved into/through Iraq. FBI exploitation teams will not conduct SSEs prior to deployment of U.S. ground combat forces into Iraq. All FBI personnel will deploy to the FOBs prior to ground combat in Iraq. FBI personnel will not conduct SSEs without specific FBIHQ approval.

The DST will be prepared to deploy along with Dol_____elements from the FOBs to facilitate the timely exploitation of documents and electronic media. These areas will be physically secured by tactical elements prior to introduction of FBI exploitation teams. The FBI and will coordinate closely with DoD regarding force protection issues.

The LNO will interface with DoD and ______ counterparts and assist in the overall coordination and support of FBI personnel deployed within the ITO. Defense of Life - Agents may use deadly force only when <u>necessary</u>, that is, when the Agents have probable cause to believe that the subject of such force poses an imminent danger of death or serious physical injury to the Agents or other persons.

- Fleeing Subject Deadly force may be used to prevent the escape of a fleeing subject if there is probable cause to believe: (1) the subject has committed a felony involving the infliction or threatened infliction of serious physical injury or death, and (2) the subject's escape would pose an imminent danger of death or serious physical injury to the Agents or other persons.
- Verbal Warnings <u>If feasible</u>, and if to do so would not increase the danger to the Agent or others, a verbal warning to submit to the authority of the Agent shall be given prior to the use of deadly force.
- D. Warning Shots No warning shots are to be fired by Agents.

Vehicles - Weapons may not be fired solely to disable moving vehicles. Weapons may be fired at the driver or other occupant of a moving motor vehicle only when the Agents have probable cause to believe that the subject poses an imminent danger of death or serious physical injury to the Agents or others, and the use of deadly force does not create a danger to the public that outweighs the likely benefits of its use.

DEFINITIONS

Deadly Force - Force that is likely to cause death or serious physical injury.

Necessity - In evaluating the <u>necessity</u> to use deadly force, two factors are relevant 1). The presence of an *imminent danger* to the Agents or others; and 2) The *absence of* safe alternatives to the use of deadly force. Deadly force is never permissible under this policy when the sole purpose is to prevent the escape of a suspect.

Imminent Danger: "Imminent" does not mean "immediate" or "instantaneous", but that an action is pending. Thus, a subject may pose an imminent danger even if he is not at that very moment pointing a weapon at the Agent. For example, imminent danger may exist if Agents have probable cause to believe any of the following:

a. The subject possesses a weapon, or is attempting to gain access to a weapon, under circumstances indicating an intention to use it against the Agents or others; or,

The subject is armed and running to gain the tactical advantage of cover,

c. A subject with the capability of inflicting death or serious physical injury—or otherwise incapacitating Agents—without a deadly weapon, is demonstrating an intention to do so; or,

d. The subject is attempting to escape from the vicinity of a violent confrontation in which he inflicted or attempted the infliction of death or serious physical injury.

Absence of a safe alternative : Agents are not required to use or consider alternatives that increase danger to themselves or to others. If a safe alternative

to the use of deadly force is likely to achieve the purpose of averting the imminent danger, deadly force is not necessary.

APPLICATION OF DEADLY FORCE

When the decision is made to use deadly force, Agents may continue its application until the subject surrenders or no longer poses an imminent danger.

When deadly force is permissible under this policy, attempts to shoot to cause minor injury are unrealistic and can prove dangerous to Agents and others because they are unlikely to achieve the intended purpose of bringing an imminent danger to a timely halt.

Even when deadly force is permissible, Agents should assess whether its use creates a danger to third parties that outweighs the likely benefits of its use.
